



Jesus' Brief Time in Ministry

Jesus' life can be divided into two parts. What is surprising is that, while he is the Son of God who came to redeem the world, he spent 90 percent of his life in the remote town of Nazareth. Only 10 percent or, at most, 30 months made up his public ministry, of preaching, healing, and teaching. It is curious, too, that his headquarters was the town of Capernaum on the shore of the Sea of Galilee—not a bustling metropolis. Archeologists say there were no more that 1,000 to 1,500 inhabitants. In fact, it was so poor it did not even have its own synagogue.

As a result, there is a real lesson to be learned about our own lived experiences, and what might be important in our lives. People talk about making a mark on this earth. And, indeed, some do that with great political or economic power. Explorers in the past also did that by discovering new lands and trading routes.

We Do Not Walk Alone

Keep in mind the short time Jesus had to accomplish his mission on earth. Truth be told, his own life and short ministry remind us that the length of time is not the most important element of our journeys. We can say this because we do not walk alone. God is constantly with us.

One thing we believe is that God has a way of using us as "instruments of peace" to do good works. There are so many people who think that they accomplish very little on earth. There is nothing spectacular they can point to—no new medical breakthrough, no new piece of literature or work of art. But what about giving life to a single human being who has more value in the eyes of God than the entire universe? The example of Jesus himself shows us that length of time is not of the essence. If we walk in faith and ask the Lord to use us as his instruments, then we can live our ordinary lives without working any miracles and simply trust that God will use us. If we have talents we think are miniscule, we must not forget what Jesus did in the little time he had. In fact, one percent of talent in God's hands is beyond human estimation.

Remember how many words Mary spoke to become the Mother of God? One single word: "Yes." One thing we have to remember, however, is that we may not even be aware of how the Lord uses us. God protects us from vanity, pride, and self-righteousness. That's why our lives are lives of faith.

Here I Am, Lord

I believe that one of the eternal joys of heaven will occur when others come up to us and astound us with their words of gratitude for something we did for them. And we will be smiling at the surprised look on the faces of others when we offer our thanks to them

In God's hands, we cannot imagine what can be done in our lives. All we have to say is, "Here I am Lord. Use me."

BLESSED MEALS TAKE US FARTHER: NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FIRST READING

WISDOM 18:6-9

The night of the passover was known beforehand ... that...they might have courage.

Sacred meals hold some of the most dangerous and subversive memories of believers. Remember the first passover in Egypt: the Israelites were asked to share the lamb, use its blood to mark their doorways, and have faith that the angel of death would pass them by on its route of destruction. How's that for a trust walk? While Egyptian households mourned their dead, Israelites walked through parted waters on their way to becoming God's free people.

As Wisdom reminds us, "the holy children of the good" knew in advance what to do and they did it. We presume those dedicated to unvirtuous living didn't notice what their neighbors were doing, had chicken that night, went to bed and woke up to anguish. Of course, it isn't about what they ate or the marks they made or failed to make. Wisdom attends to God's voice and heeds what it hears. The angel of death still makes the rounds today. If we live as God requires, the sea of death itself will part for us.

SECOND READING

HEBREWS 11:1-2, 8-19

By faith Abraham went out, not knowing where he was to go.

Some of us are pleased to stay in place, living our whole lives in one town or even one house. Others are driven to wander, following wherever curiosity or courage takes us. Abraham is more or less the patron saint of the wanderer. He took a journey into the dark with only trust in God as his guide. And because he did, the story of a people took shape ahead of Abraham, composed of countless generations and never-ending stories.

How far did Abraham go? From present-day Iraq to present-day Israel, in purely geographic terms. But he also took a journey from a culture based on idol worship to faith in a single God he came to know as friend. Abraham crossed the distance from being childless to becoming a father; from poverty to abundance; from wheeler-dealer to one content to wait on God to fulfill every promise. The adventure Abraham embarked on wasn't about miles but about character. The man who left home is not the man who finally arrived.

LUKE 12:32-48

"Amen, I say to you, the master will gird himself, and have his servants recline at table."

In what fantasy scenario does the CEO wait on his aides? Does a prime minister ever serve in a soup kitchen, or an estate owner set the table for her grounds crew? It sounds fantastic to imagine the scene that Jesus describes, a master waiting table on his house staff. Yet this is how Jesus himself will act, when he washes the feet of his followers at the Last Supper.

This reversal of roles in servant leadership is not entirely rare, of course. Don't parents put themselves and their resources at the service of their children: not for an hour but for a lifetime? Don't teachers labor painstakingly through the years to bring their students along with ABCs and 1-2-3s? Missionary medical crews put their expertise to use for the sake of those who can never repay them. When those with resources serve those in need, wonderful things are possible. Set the table for someone soon.


