





One Minute Meditations

St. Hedwig of Silesia

Raised by a duke,

Hedwig was married to Duke Henry of Silesia, the head of the Polish Royal family. They had a happy marriage and together founded a convent, hospitals, and monasteries. They had seven children, two of whom caused them significant trouble with their rivalries. St. Hedwig convinced them to stop fighting and they reconciled. After her husband's death, Hedwig became a Cistercian nun and lived simply, giving her wealth for charity.

Ignore more

Ironically, it actually feels good to walk away from a fight. Jesus knew that when he said, "When someone strikes you on (your) right cheek, turn the other one to him as well" (Matthew 5:39). He wants us to make a point of ignoring slights or insults, even if they sting. Next time you feel annoyed or hurt, turn your cheek and walk peacefully away.

"We love because he first loved us" (1 John 4:19).



Our Father knows best

After months of unemployment, Mike was glad to find a job but disappointed that it paid considerably less and had poorer benefits than the old one. Jen and her husband prayed for a beautiful house in their favorite neighborhood

but the financing fell through and they ended up with a smaller house on the other side of town. What happened to the power of prayer?

Understand that our way isn't God's way. God always listens to our prayers but he doesn't necessarily answer the way we expect. Yet we know no one is more qualified to lead us than the Creator of the universe. We must trust

him with all our concerns.

Don't set your heart on an outcome. Asking God to double your income may not be reasonable. Instead put your worries in his hands. Know

that your Father has
your best interest in
mind and will
find what is right
for you.

Be open to alternatives.
Sometimes taking a different job or buying a less

expensive home is the better choice. You may net more personal time and less overall stress.

Let scripture speak to you. "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, on your own intelligence rely not; In all your ways be mindful of him, and he will make straight your paths" (Proverbs 3:5-6).

Why Do Catholics Do That

Why do Catholics make pilgrimages?

Making pilgrimages to holy sites accomplishes a number of things: it reminds us that our faith is founded on miraculous events that really happened, in a specific place and time (e.g. Calvary Hill, c.A.D.33). Journeying to the site of an apparition or

to a church holding saints' relics also encourages us to reflect on their example of virtue and imitate them in our own lives. Lastly, "Pilgrimages evoke our earthly journey toward heaven"

(Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), #2691).

Follow the Rosary to treasure

The Rosary is like an ancient treasure map. It has led countless faithful to the treasures of peace, joy, clarity, and contentment. If you follow where it leads, you'll find that a devotion to praying the Rosary can transform your life.

Shelter in a chaotic world. Leading hectic lives can fog the mind, unsettle the soul, and turn us away from God. Yet, our souls are made for peace. Praying the Rosary settles our thoughts. It puts us at ease, creating a peace that is otherworldly.

Perspective. Humans are constantly changing, thus our relationship with God changes. The Rosary provides the context, the format, and the process for God to speak to us about all these things.

Mary's blessing. Nobody sees the life of a child the way that child's mother does. Our Lady has a mother's perspective of Jesus' life. Learning and sharing that perspective helps us ponder the life of Jesus through the eyes of his Mother. This is a powerful experience if we enter into it fully.

from Scripture

Luke 18:9-14, God wants only love

In this Gospel passage, Jesus compared the prayers of a proud Pharisee and a humble tax collector—which probably scandalized his audience. Pharisees were considered the model for faithful Jews, while tax collectors, who worked for the Romans (and stole a little extra money on the side), were considered traitors by their fellow

The Pharisee marched up to a position of honor in the temple to pray, presumably to be seen and admired. His prayer wasn't really a prayer of thanksgiving, but self-praise. By contrast,

the tax collector humbled himself before God and offered only a simple prayer casting himself on God's mercy. He went home justified.

Promoting oneself in prayer is unnecessary:

God already knows and loves us, and he wants us to love him in return. When you love someone, you'd never do anything

to hurt them, and if you did, you'd apologize right away and try to fix it. With God, we have to call on his grace and mercy to make amends. In the end, our love counts for more than anything else we do.



Oct. 7 – Our Lady of the Rosary (1571). Pope Gregory XIII named this feast because it was believed that Christians won a critical victory at the Battle of Lepanto after praying the Rosary.

Oct. 15 – St. Teresa of Ávila (1582). Teresa joined the Carmelites, against her father's wishes. In 1563, she was inspired to reform her order. Despite serious opposition, she founded more than 17 convents of Discalced Carmelites and helped reform the Carmelite friars.

October 17 – St. Ignatius of Antioch

(d.c. 107). Successor to St. Peter as Bishop of Antioch, Ignatius was sentenced to death for his faith. On route to Rome, he wrote letters, encouraging his fellow Christians to remain faithful.

Oct. 28 – SS. Simon and Jude (1st Century). St. Simon was a Zealot – Jews who believed that the Messiah would free them from political oppression. St. Jude was a fisherman. After being called by Jesus to be

by Jesus to be apostles, they eventually traveled to Persia where they preached the Gospel until they were martyred.





Why should I read the Bible?

The Bible is the world's longest love letter. As part of the deposit of faith, it's a treasure-trove of our inheritance as children of God. Here are three

benefits of reading Scripture:

We encounter God. We not only learn about God from the Bible, but we actually encounter him in our hearts when we pray

with Scripture. "In the sacred books, the Father who is in heaven comes lovingly to meet his children, and talks with them" (CCC, #104).

Packed with sound advice. Books like Sirach, Proverbs, and Wisdom have practical advice on how to virtuously handle relationships, home life, business, and dealing with difficult people. If we want to know what this looks like in action, the Gospels give us Christ's teaching and example.

It is a "roadmap" to heaven. Like a map, Scripture outlines what we need to know about God and his saving plan. The Magisterium, who interprets the Scriptures under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, holds the "key" to reading the "map" (CCC, #100).



Our Lady of the Rosary This feast celebrates the victory of God through the intercession of Our Lady, Queen of the Rosary. This feast was formalized in the 16th century. The feast commemorates the day that the naval forces of several Christian nations defeated invading Turkish naval forces in the Lepanto, off the west coast of Greece. The Rosary was already an established pious practice at this time. Leading up to this battle, the Pope Pius V asked Christians throughout Europe to pray the Rosary for a successful defense, and Christians throughout Europe and naval crew members on over 200 naval ships prayed. Members of the Confraternity of the Rosary were also gathered in Rome that day, praying for the victory of the naval forces. On Sunday, October 7, 1571, a naval victory was

won against the invading Ottoman Turkish fleet. Pope Pius V attributed the victory to the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary through the prayers of the Rosary. In 1572 the pope established a commemoration in honor of Our Lady of Victory, and in 1573 the feast was changed to Our Lady of the Rosary, celebrated on the first Sunday of October. The pope extended the feast to the universal Church in 1716, and in 1913 the feast day was fixed to October 7. The month of October is traditionally dedicated to the Holy Rosary.

THE RIGHT KIND OF PASSION: TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

FIRST READING

HABAKKUK 1:2-3; 2:2-4

How long, O LORD? I cry for help but you do not listen!

Outrage happens. Those of us with short fuses can be set off by sluggish restaurant service or the frustrating ways our technology fails to provide on demand. For the more placid personality, it may take a magnitude of social injustice or a personal betrayal to really get our blood boiling. But sooner or later, we all find ourselves raging against the system, the opposition, or the tragic limitations of our humanity. We all sit in Habakkuk's chair, wondering how God could allow things to come to this.

Habakkuk is the only biblical prophet to initiate his dialogue with God. Every other seer on record is drafted into the role of divine ambassador, commissioned to tell the nation what's what and what's coming if the people don't get their acts together. Habakkuk is driven by his outrage to deliver to God his dissatisfaction with what's what. He also has the stamina to stay for the reply – which might blow the average complainer out of the room. Bring your most honest self to the divine encounter. And don't leave early.

» Are you holding anything back in your relationship with God? Have you ever had a Habakkuk moment?

SECOND READING

2 TIMOTHY 1:6-8, 13-14

God did not give us a spirit of cowardice, but of power and love and self-control.

We admire the bravery of superheroes, soldiers, firefighters, and law enforcers. These folks put it all on the line, gambling their earth's acre for a prize that is by no means a sure thing. What drives people of courage to risk so much? What compels most of us to risk so little?

Perhaps we're a little braver than we think. Consider the courage of parents who bring a child into the world. They take on a lifetime of love and responsibility for a virtual stranger. Think of the new teacher, entering that first classroom, or the small business owner, hiring that first employee. Community organizers and missionaries hold fast to hope in situations no one's yet been able to fix. Journalists in the field press past fear to get to the truth. Medical workers and chaplains sit with the sick, the suffering, and the dying, helping them to face the unknown. The territory of courage is a lot wider than we normally imagine.

» Take stock of your relationships and responsibilities. How are you being called to be a hero today?

GOSPEL

LUKE 17:5-10

The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith."

How much faith does it take to become the saint we're each summoned to be? As it turns out, not a whole lot. Faith, remember, doesn't mean checking off a list of things about God and religion we're willing to accept: divinity, Trinity, eternity, papacy Faith is not "about" anything; it's "in" a relationship of trust. If we trust God even a little, Jesus says, God can do a lot with that.

Yet even the apostles make the mistake of believing that more faith will make them lions in God's service. The truth is often sadder than they perceive: many of us operate day to day with no display of faith at all. We say our prayers and make our Sunday obligations - and then decide all the really important things in life as if God were out of the room. What would happen if we take our mustard seed of trust in God and plant it down deep in our families, our work, our financial and moral choices, and our goals for the future? Miracles begin at the point we take that seed of faith seriously.

» Do you trust God: with your loved ones, your vocation, your resources, your time? How do vou demonstrate this?
