Nazareth, home of the 'Carpenter's Son,' in you I would choose to understand and proclaim the severe and redeeming law of human work...To conclude, I want to greet all the workers of the world, holding up to them their great pattern, their brother who is God''²²⁵ (CCC, 533).

Did You Know?

In Webster's New World Dictionary of the American Language, second college edition, the word "resolution" has nine definitions. Some of these definitions are: 1. a) the act or process of resolving something or breaking it up into its constituent parts or elements...5. a solving, as of a puzzle, or answering, as of a question; solution...7. Med. The subsidence or disappearance of swelling, fever, or other manifestation of disease...8. Music a) the passing of a dissonant chord (or tone in a chord) to a consonant chord (or tone)...9. Optics the capability of an optical system of making clear and distinguishable the separate parts or components of an object or of differentiating between sources of light.

In order for New Year's resolutions to work, first we need to make them! Secondly, if we apply these few definitions, certainly we will see some results. Many times our lives may seem dissonant, puzzling, and filled with questions. We may struggle through an illness or problem. Sometimes we move to the beat of our own drum and our chords do not always meet or pass on to another person. We can lose the capability to distinguish God's presence and work in our lives. Sometimes we cannot see goodness clearly, or the sources of light around us, nor within us.

Jesus is waiting for us to come and give our resolution of faith, to decide once again to walk with God.

May you be resolute in your New Year's resolution(s) by "having or showing a fixed, firm purpose; determined; resolved; unwavering." And may you always stay close to Jesus and Mary.

Christmas is one of the most important days of the Church year, second only to Easter itself. It is the feast of the incarnation, the feast of God becoming flesh (the Latin "in carne" means "enfleshment." It is a uniquely Christian teaching, the Divine choosing to become one of us. Because of this belief, God is not only Transcendent, but also wholly Immanent, Emmanuel (God-with-us). While remaining Transcendent (meaning we must rise above our present condition to reach Him), He is at the same time Immanent (meaning He is with us as we rise toward Him). Every Eucharist is like Christmas where the bread and wine are transformed into His flesh, His Body and Blood, and, in a sense, He is born anew on the altar.

The liturgical season of Christmas begins with the vigil Masses on Christmas Eve and concludes on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. During this season, we celebrate the birth of Christ into our world and into our hearts, and reflect on the gift of salvation that is born with him...including the fact that he was born to die for us.

The Christmas tree and the Nativity scene are popular symbols of the season and a tradition in many Christian homes. It is also traditional to exchange Christmas gifts with family and friends as a way to honor God the Father's gift of his only son to the world. PROTECT THE CHILD OF PROMISE: FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY, AND JOSEPH

FIRST READING

SIRACH 3:2-6, 12-14

God sets a father in honor over his children, a mother's authority over her sons.

Father, mother, and children. This classic pyramid of the family is not as commonplace as it used to be. Yet what's true in any situation involving children is that there are two kinds of people: the kids themselves, and the grownups in charge of protecting them. As we all know to our shame, not all adults have the welfare of children at heart.

Children are to be nurtured, taught, encouraged, corrected, protected, and guided until they are ready to take their place in society as adults themselves. Where this is done well and with love, healthy societies emerge. When this is done half-heartedly or badly, damaged souls and crippled future families are the result. There is no dollar spent on nourishing the bodies, minds, and hearts of children that is wasted. If you have children, love them. If you don't, the world is full of children who need your love.

» What have you done for the next generation today? What will you do for them this week?

SECOND READING

COLOSSIANS 3:12-21

And whatever you do...do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus.

Family systems vary from culture to culture, and they evolve through history. They're not cookie cutter even in a single neighborhood. I grew up in a three generational household with fifteen people in it. It was a good life, if a bit crowded. Yet, perhaps as a result of that experience, I've lived most of my adult life alone. The sound of silence is lovely.

However we style our lives, it remains true that we live in relationship to others. Paul describes the typical household of the Roman era: wives, husbands, children (and slaves) all performing their expected roles. We take issue with the form of those alliances today, but not the substance. Family members do have responsibilities toward each other, as do neighbors, citizens, and countries. Humans also have duties toward the planet that sustains us. If we neglect what holds us together, we'll be driven

GOSPEL

MATTHEW 2:13-15, 19-23

"Rise, take the child and his mother, flee to Egypt."

Joseph's child was in danger. Never mind for a moment the precise relationship between this man, the child, and his mother. What mattered most is the commitment Joseph had made to take both of them into his home. They were his family. And the child was in jeopardy. What else could he do but make arrangements to spirit them off to safety?

Migrants and refugees are always at the mercy of strangers when they leave their homeland. Will there be hospitality at the far end of their journey? Would their last state be worst than the first? We know nothing of what Mary and Joseph encountered in their travels abroad. But we do know they wanted what all refugees thirst for: the chance to return home someday, when conditions are more favorable and the threat to security is past. As soon as it was possible, Joseph steered his family back toward
