





**30**—the Advent kickoff— there are other saints with feast days during Advent that have special cultural traditions associated with them. St.

Nicholas Day is on December 6, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception (a Holy Day of Obligation) is December 8th, Our Lady of Guadalupe Feast Day is December 12, and St. Lucy's feast day is December 13.

# Blessing of the Advent Wreath



The use of the Advent Wreath is a traditional practice Lord our God, which has found its place in the Church as well as in the home. The blessing of an Advent Wreath takes place on the First Sunday of Advent or on the evening he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, before the First Sunday of Advent.

When the blessing of the Advent Wreath is celebrated let your blessing come upon us in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another member of the family.

All make the sign of the cross as the leader says:

Our help is in the name of the Lord. Response (R/.) Who made heaven and earth.

Then the Scripture, Isaiah 9: (lines 1-2 and 5-6) or Isaiah 63 (lines 16-17 & 19) or Isaiah 64 (lines 2-7) is read:

Reader: The Word of the Lord. R/. Thanks be to God.

With hands joined, the leader says:

we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, he is the Savior of every nation. Lord God,

as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord. R/. Amen.

The blessing may conclude with a verse from "O Come. O Come. Emmanuel":

O come, desire of nations, bind in one the hearts of humankind; bid ev'ry sad division cease and be thyself our Prince of peace. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

#### **Special Advent Prayers**

**Adopt special prayers during the Advent season**. You can often find them in Advent devotional books.

There is the **St. Andrew Christmas Novena** which is traditionally prayed from the feast of St. Andrew (November 30) until Christmas Eve.

Another tradition is praying the **O Antiphons from the Liturgy of the Hours in the eight days leading up to Christmas.** The O Antiphons are the antiphons of the Evening Prayers
(Vespers) during the week before Christmas. Each antiphon welcome the birth of the Savior by
heralding one of the resplendent Biblical titles of the soon-to-be-born Son of God as
foreshadowed in the Old Testament by the prophet Isaiah.

Jesse Tree: If you have kids, the Jesse Tree (named after the father of King David, the ancestor of Jesus, as mentioned in Isaiah 11) is a fun biblical activity during the Advent season which prepares for the birth of Christ and his mission. It's fun for kids and great catechesis. It goes through the ancestry of Jesus and how all of his ancestors played a role in salvation history. The tree created can then be used as a holiday decoration.

BESIDES HIS FIRST COMING AT HIS BIRTH, JESUS COMES TO OUR LIVES THROUGH THE SACRAMENTS (ESPECIALLY THE EUCHARIST), THROUGH THE WORD OF GOD, THROUGH THE WORSHIPING COMMUNITY, AT THE MOMENT OF OUR DEATH AND, FINALLY, IN HIS SECOND COMING TO JUDGE THE

t's a time of great anticipation as we await the arrival of Christ on Christmas morning. In fact, the word Advent comes from the Latin word ad-venire that means coming or arriving.

Just as in Lent, the liturgical color of Advent is purple. Both of the seasons prepare for great feast days in the Church year. The purple color also connotes the penitential dimension of the season as Advent is a time of preparing, quieting and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas. The altar is also meant to be decorated in a more restrained manner during this season.

The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and also to the anniversary of the Lord's birth on Christmas. Right in the middle of Advent, several Marian feasts are also celebrated. They are the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary and the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. The final days of Advent, from December 17 to December 24, focus particularly on our preparation for the celebrations of the Nativity of our Lord (Christmas).

"At Christmas, we on earth receive Jesus, the bread from heaven. It is a bread that never grows stale, but enables us even now to have a foretaste of eternal life. . . I want to come to Bethlehem, Lord, because there you await me. I want to realize that you, lying in a manger, are the bread of my life.
