OBLIGATION TO ATTEND MASS ON SUNDAYS AND HOLY DAYS WAS REINSTATED IN JUNE OF 2021

"Together, the Bishops of Ohio have decided that the general obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (including the Saturday/Vigil Mass) is to be reinstated (CIC, can. 1247). This will take effect in each of the Dioceses of Ohio the weekend of June 5-6, 2021. As has always been the case, those who have a serious reason are exempt from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 2181). This includes those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immuno-compromised or ill. Masses that are broadcast through various media are not intended as a substitute nor do they fulfill the obligation for the persons who are able to gather for a Sunday celebration and other Holy Days of Obligation. Instead, they are intended for the sick, homebound, the imprisoned, etc., who are unable to attend Mass in person. Kindly consult your pastor with any specific questions regarding the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation." Reprinted from *The Catholic Times*, May 13, 2021




OHIO NOW OFFERS A PROGRAM TO RECEIVE A 100% TAX CREDIT FOR TUITION ASSISTANCE CONTRIBUTIONS UP TO \$750.

Our Catholic Schools in the Diocese of Columbus have made **tuition assistance a philanthropic priority**. And now, our Diocesan Education Corporation is the first organization in the State of Ohio to be **certified as a Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO)** by the Ohio Attorney General.



ABOUT THE SGO CERTIFICATION

- The SGO program was created in 2021 for the State of Ohio.
- A tax credit for gifts in support of tuition assistance is an investment with immediate and long-term benefits.
- No forms are needed to make a gift.
- Donor receipts will be generated in accordance with **tax credit and charitable gift qualifications**.
- Although the tax credit is limited to \$750 per person, there is no minimum or maximum donation amount. No gift is too big or too small.



HOW DO I BENEFIT?

- A 100% tax credit up to \$750 per person per year (\$1,500 for those married filing jointly).
- Those who itemize may still claim additional charitable donations on state and federal taxes and receive the Ohio tax credit.



FAITH FORMATION

Immaculate Conception Church January 9, 2022



"As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful that I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.'

Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.''' [Lk. 3:15-6,21-22]

In this particular passage, a great importance was given to the Holy Spirit. Throughout the Holy Bible, many amazing manifestations were credited to the presence of the Spirit, as the life and power of God. Such is seen in the creation [Gen. 1:2] and the warriors. [Judges 3:10, 11:29, 1 Sam. 11:6] But now, the Holy Spirit is identified as a separate Divine Presence in the Blessed Trinity. While the voice of the Heavenly Father was heard from Heaven, the Holy Spirit descended upon Jesus in bodily form like a dove.

When we hear that "all the people were baptized," we perceive a new episode, a whole community advancing towards the new and most joyful promised land, the spiritual Kingdom of God on earth. So great was the Divine Presence of God in the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, that all the people were touched, repented of their sins and were baptized. There was no space left for doubters. The voice of God from Heaven echoes the Heavenly Father's desire and determination to save His people.

Through the Words, "You are my Son." the Heavenly Father confesses the Divinity of Jesus. Jesus is God incarnated in human form. It should be noted that Jesus did not get baptized because He needed to repent of His sins. Being God, He was without sin! Why then was He baptized? Because from the moment of His birth to the moment when He began His ministry on earth, Jesus completely submitted Himself in obedience to the customs of His people. By submitting Himself to the Baptism of John the Baptist, He placed His seal of approval that we all need to repent of our sins.

But there was more to it then could be perceived at that time. Jesus' example of being baptized was to tell us that the Sacrament of Baptism is the Way to the new life, to being born again of water and spirit. As Jesus said, "Very truly, I tell you, no one can enter the Kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit." [Jn. 3:5]

What is Ordinary Time?


After the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, Ordinary Time begins. "Besides the times of the year that have their own distinctive character, there remains in the yearly cycle thirty-three or thirty-four weeks in which no particular aspect of the mystery of Christ is celebrated, but rather the mystery of Christ itself is honored in its fullness, especially on Sundays. This period is known as Ordinary Times. (Universal Norms, 43)
