# **Evangelical Catholic**

Father Matt reported that training for Evangelical Catholic is ongoing and will last into June. More people will be invited into this ongoing discipleship. Local news coverage about the possible closure of Our Lady of Peace and the expansion of The Magical Druid highlights the need for evangelizing in our local community.

Father also asked council's views on signage pertaining to masks as well as the presence of hand sanitizers. How to prepare for all of the Holy Week liturgies was also discussed with a focus on how to deal with potential overflow congregations.
