DIOCESE OF COLUMBUS CHILD PROTECTION PLAN

It is the goal of the Diocese of Columbus to make the Church a place of safety: a place of prayer, ministry and comfort. Everyone who enters our churches, schools, or facilities must be confident in this. Not one child or young person should suffer from abuse while at Church. In order to assure the safety of our youth, the Diocese of Columbus has enacted a complete program of protection. As part of this program, the Diocese of Columbus will provide appropriate, just, and pastoral care for anyone who has suffered the crime of sexual abuse of a minor at the hands of diocesan clergy or church employees or volunteers. The Diocese of Columbus will report any and all allegations of abuse reported to it and to the authorities and will cooperate fully with those authorities.



"I will follow you wherever you go." On the other hand we say to him, "But first let me go and" You probably know what that's like. I know I do. When have you experienced that tension? Feast of Sts Peter and Paul June 29



These men would become two of the Church's greatest saints from the apostolic era. Peter and Paul had both been great sinners. Peter had denied Jesus not just once (as did Judas Iscariot, who unfortunately entered into despair rather than repenting), nor twice, but three times. Paul had been a fierce persecutor of Christians, consenting to the martyrdom of many.

Despite their many differences, Peter and Paul both repented and truly followed the Lord, allowing their hearts to be converted to his will for the remainder of their lives, never denying him again. They served the Lord faithfully for decades after Jesus respectively called each of them to follow him, collaborating with other Apostles as they served the early Church.

They ultimately gave their lives for the Lord by being martyred in Rome around AD 64 under the harsh persecutions by the Emperor Nero. (Peter was notoriously crucified upside down, and Paul was beheaded.)
