




Word of God Sunday: Ways of Reading Scripture

In September 2019, Pope Francis issued an apostolic letter *motu proprio* called <u>Aperuit Illis</u>. In this apostolic letter, he declared that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time "is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God."

Liturgical Reading: This is the primary setting for reading the Word of God. Much of the Bible was written to be read at the Liturgy. Continuous Reading: This situates individual texts within the whole of the Bible.

Contemplative Reading: The Bible is meant to be prayed. Exegesis: "Exegesis" means "to draw the meaning out of the text." Study of the Word of God is essential, since the Scriptures were written far away and many years ago.

Read the Bible in a Spirit of Prayer: This is the Word of God: "Speak, Lord. Your servant is listening." (I Samuel 3:9)




Read Slowly: The best plan for reading a book of the Bible is: a) Skim through it, reading the section headings, to get an idea of the whole. Read any introductions which are provided. b) Read through, slowly, one section at a time. Check the notes (especially useful in The New Jerusalem Bible or The Oxford Annotated Bible With Apocrypha). Perhaps check a commentary. Mark up your Bible. c) Read and reread the section. Memorize some parts. Try reading aloud.

Adopt a Plan: You might want to read a chapter (or a smaller section) a day, perhaps in this order: the Gospels, the Psalms, the rest of the New Testament, the Wisdom books of the Old Testament (Proverbs, Sirach, Wisdom, Qoheleth, Song of Songs, Job), then the rest of the Old Testament. An excellent plan: read the Mass readings for the day. Over the course of 2 years, at daily Mass, almost the whole of the Bible is read. www.catholiclink.com

DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE LEGAL PROTECTION OF THE UNBORN

January 22 is designated as the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children". It is a day of prayer and penance.

The Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children serves as a reminder of the Church's unwavering stance on the inherent dignity and value of every human life. It is a time for Catholics and believers alike to come together in prayer, seeking God's guidance and intervention in protecting the unborn. This day serves as an opportunity to unite in prayer, seeking God's mercy, healing, and guidance for those affected by abortion and for the protection of all unborn children.



The Catholic Church holds a profound belief in the sanctity of human life, recognizing its inherent dignity and value from the moment of conception. This fundamental teaching is rooted in the belief that every human being is created in the image and likeness of God, and therefore possesses an inherent worth that cannot be diminished or disregarded.

One key document that provides theological context for this teaching is "Evangelium Vitae" (The Gospel of Life), written by Pope John Paul II. In this encyclical, the Pope reaffirms the Church's stance on the sanctity of life and condemns any act that directly attacks or destroys innocent human life, including abortion, euthanasia, and capital punishment. 





JUBILEE OF THE SACRED HEART PILGRIMAGE


