

Through training from CRS, they learned how to better manage their crops to improve production. Adolf and his wife, Florence, are farmers in Akwangagwel, Uganda. Their family works hard each day to garden, clean, prepare meals and care for the animals. In the evenings, they enjoy spending time together. In the area where they live, the climate is very dry. Lately, the rainy season has been coming later than it used to. And sometimes, it rains too much all at once and causes flooding. To adapt, Adolf and Florence joined a Catholic Relief Services program where they learned new farming methods that help them grow crops even when it is hot and dry. This provides enough food to eat and to sell at the market for extra income. They now share the knowledge they learned with others, so that their community can thrive as well.





#2 - Pontifical Good Friday Collection





On your holy mountain he revealed himself in glory in the presence of his disciples. He had already prepared them for his approaching death. He wanted to teach them through the Law and the Prophets that the promised Christ had first to supper and so come to the glory of his resurrection.

Similar to how the binding of Isaac prefigures the crucifixion of Jesus, the Gospel for the 2nd Sunday of Lent anticipates His resurrection. It is a pivotal moment that bridges His earthly ministry with the glory of His resurrection. It serves as a divine affirmation of Jesus' sonship and His messianic fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets, represented by the figures of Moses and Elijah. This event is not only a foretaste of the resurrected life but also a call to recognize Jesus as the culmination of God's salvific plan.

Obedience and Sonship: Both Isaac and Jesus demonstrate obedience to their father's will. How does this model of obedience challenge or inspire your relationship with God? In what ways are you called to demonstrate your sonship or daughtership in God through obedience?

The Journey of Lent: As Lent is a season of reflection, penance, and preparation, how do these themes and questions guide you in your Lenten journey? What specific steps can you take to align your life more closely with the lessons of faith, sacrifice, and divine revelation highlighted in these readings? youngcatholic.com

Lent and confession go hand in hand in two ways. The former is the season of conversion, and the latter is one of the greatest means of conversion. The Church exhorts her children to go to Jesus for healing. "'Yet even now,' says the LORD, 'return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments.' Return to the LORD, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and repents of evil" (Joel 2:12–13). Second, Lent is there to build the Church up to celebrating Easter. The Church has crafted the liturgical calendar such that the feast of Easter has an entire 40 days of preparation. Going to Confession is one of the greatest sources of grace available to us in our Catholic faith. In this Sacrament, the Holy Spirit continues to work in us through conversion and forgiveness. We are enabled to grow in self-knowledge and humility. We begin to see our selfish habits with greater clarity, making it possible for us to correct them and root out sin. We purify our consciences, strengthen our wills, receive the grace to resist temptation, and advance in the spiritual life.

For these reasons—and many others—the Catholic Church takes this sacrament very seriously. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) asks faithful Catholics in the United States to go to Confession at least once during Lent and once during Advent. goodcatholic.com
