

MESSAGE FROM FR. MATT

Happy Easter! Thank you for your participation in our Holy Week services, these celebrations were wonderful and full of many blessings! Here at Immaculate Conception, we are responding to the call to continued spiritual growth and discipleship. I would like to share a few of the upcoming ways we will be embracing this call:

The Disciple Maker Index (DMI) Parish Survey - April 9, 2024

First, we are inviting each of our adult parishioners (18 to 110) to participate in the Disciple Maker Index (DMI), which is a survey tool provided by the Catholic Leadership Institute. As we embrace our call to discipleship, we know how important it is to create a culture of openness; one that practices listening to one another. We want to hear and respond to how we can best serve each other. This is especially true as our parish is growing! We have new families and parishioners joining us and we want to hear from you, too! We feel an important step in this process involves reassessing our strengths and opportunities as a parish. That is where the Disciple Maker Index (DMI) comes in! We participated in this same survey back in February of 2021. We would love to hear how our community has grown and changed since then. By participating in this survey, you will be invited to reflect and share about your discipleship journey here at IC. It will allow you to provide your perspective on our parish's efforts to help you grow in relationship with Christ. All responses will be confidential; the parish will only receive information about the community as a whole. This survey only takes 10-15 minutes to complete and will be available to take through an online link, beginning Tuesday, April 9. We will send out additional communications and provide the link to participate when the survey launches. Paper surveys will also be available next weekend for those who cannot complete the survey online.

Parish Staff Leadership Immersive Retreat - April 22-26, 2024

Secondly, our Parish Staff members will be attending a week-long Leadership Immersive retreat, hosted by *Acts XXIX*, which is the same organization that developed *The Rescue Project* with Fr. John Riccardo. This will be an off-site retreat for our parish staff members, so the Parish Office will be minimally staffed during the week of April 22 – 26, 2024. This retreat strengthens parish ministry leaders in the mission of serving the Church.

Fall Sabbatical in Italy - September-November 2024

Thirdly, this fall I will be taking a Sabbatical through the *Institute for Continuing Theological Education* in Rome, Italy. What is a Sabbatical? The word comes from the same root word as "Sabbath." In other words, it is a dedicated time of rest with the Lord. This time of rest and renewal allows priests to dedicate more time to study, prayer, and spiritual renewal. Taking a "sabbath," or a time of rest, is something God calls each one of us to do. I will be joining with other priests from many other dioceses on this Sabbatical program where we will be studying the development of the Nicene Creed. While I am away, Fr. Jerry Rodenfels will be our parish administrator with continued assistance from our retired priests.

I will continue to share more details with you as the day comes closer. Be assured I look forward to returning with renewed energy and experiences to share with you!

Immaculate Conception Church April 7, 2024



Divine Mercy Sunday is a day celebrated on the Octave of Easter, the Sunday after Easter Sunday. It is a day to celebrate the love and mercy of God, which is available to all those who ask for it. The day was established by Pope John Paul II in 2000, and it is a day to approach the fount of God's mercy and ask for forgiveness. The day is centered on the theme of Divine Mercy and forgiveness, and it is a reminder of the merciful love of God that lies behind the whole Paschal Mystery.

According to the <u>USCCB</u>, the Diary of Saint Faustina "records 14 occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy (Divine Mercy Sunday) be observed."

"My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the Fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. ... Let no soul fear to draw near to Me. ... It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the Fount of My Mercy." (Diary, no. 699)



ANNUNCIATION

Why is the Annunciation celebrated on March 25? This year it is celebrated on April 8

The Solemnity of the Annunciation is celebrated nine months before the Nativity of the Lord, a feast which came about earlier historically. The Annunciation recalls the day when the Archangel Gabriel appeared to Mary and revealed God's will that she become the Mother of the Son of God, and she accepted. At that moment, the "Word became Flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14).

In 2024, because it would otherwise fall during Holy Week, the Annunciation will be observed on Monday, April 8. EWTN




