

The Appeal, through its support of Catholic Education and Faith Formation, funds the


Catechism programs and diocesan resources for parishes like ours. It assists our staff in preparing our children and adults for these blessed sacraments that bring them closer to our Father.







FAITH FORMATION

As we either read or hear these familiar and loving words of Jesus: "My peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you." How do they impact you? I like to think of them as those peaceful moments in life. When all seems right with the world. When a sense of calm fills your heart and mind. When you're not stressed about everything you have to do or everything going on in your life. So, do you get a sense of and experience the peace and presence of Jesus? When we are upset, troubled or fearful Jesus may feel very far away. At these times, if we consciously breathe in his peace and his presence, we may begin to experience his presence with us.

We need to stop and breathe in the love, the peace, and the presence of Jesus for a few minutes. We can know God's peace, which is real, deep, and meaningful, and the 'peace of God passes all understanding'. We can also know joy and purpose in our lives, but it requires us to do something. We need to love Jesus, and this is not some superficial, sentimental experience, it is practical and significant, we need to be obedient to what he calls us to do. When we do this, God comes to us and makes his home within us. 

UPCOMING LITURGICAL FEASTS IN THE CHURCH

AND WHY THEY ARE IMPORTANT

The Ascension is a liturgical Solemnity celebrated by all the Christian Churches. It falls on the fortieth day after Easter Sunday. Saint John Chrysostom and Saint Augustine make reference to it, but it was probably Saint Gregory of Nyssa who influenced the propagation of the feast. Since it falls on Thursday, in many countries, this Solemnity is transferred to the following Sunday. With his Ascension into heaven, the presence of the "historical Christ" comes to an end, and the presence of the Body of Christ, the Church, is inaugurated.



We do not await the last day idly, nor do we close ourselves in our own homes. But, as Jesus reminds us, we await the last day dedicated to a mission that reaches the ends of the earth. "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses...to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:7ff). We are fortified by Jesus's promise: "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Mt. 28:19), where Jesus is our God, God-with-us (see Ex 3:12), Emmanuel (see Mt. 1:23; Is. 7:14). vaticannews.va

The Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary

This feast was established by Pope Urban VI in 1389 in order to bring the Great Schism to an end through the intercession of Mary. It originated in Byzantium when, on 2 July, the Gospel of Mary's visit to Elizabeth was read on the Feast of the "Deposition in the Basilica of the Holy Garment of the Theotokos". The Franciscans adopted this Marian feast day in 1263, calling it the Visitation of Mary. After the liturgical reform of the Second Vatican Council, the date for the feast was fixed on 31 May, at the end of the month dedicated to Mary.

It is helpful to recall that we do not have a journalist's account of this meeting. Rather Luke, speaking for the Church, gives a prayerful poet's rendition of the scene. Elizabeth's praise of Mary as "the mother of my Lord" can be viewed as the earliest Church's devotion to Mary. As with all authentic devotion to Mary, Elizabeth's (the Church's) words first praise God for what God has done to Mary. Only secondly does she praise Mary for trusting God's words.

Then comes the *Magnificat* (Luke 1:46-55). Here, Mary herself—like the Church—traces all her greatness to God. franciscanmedia.org

Religious Workforce Protection Act Your Action Urgently Needed

What is the Religious Workforce Protection Act?

On April 9, several U.S. Representatives introduced the Religious Workforce Protection Act, bipartisan legislation to allow religious workers on temporary status with pending applications to stay in the U.S. while waiting for permanent residency. The bill aims to address delays in processing these applications, which can force religious workers to return to their home countries, disrupting services provided by religious institutions. The Religious Workforce Protection Act would allow religious workers to extend their temporary status, enabling them to continue essential services in American communities. There is an equivalent bill in the U.S. Senate.

In the Diocese of Columbus, there are 21 priests and 13 sisters who would be impacted. Three seminarians are presently on student visas, but upon ordination would need to be transferred to a temporary visa and would also be impacted. The impact on diocesan parishes, schools, and Catholic healthcare ministry would be significant.

Bishop Fernandes has worked hard to help promote this legislation for more than two years, and he encourages parishioners to write to their congressional representatives and senators to support this bill.

"If I could emphasize the urgency of this with any greater force I would. Our brothers help us in providing access to the sacraments across the Diocese of Columbus." - Bishop Fernandes


