





Jesus said to his disciples: "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And behold I am sending the promise of my Father upon you; but stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high." Luke 24:46–49

And with that, the earthly mission of Jesus was completed and He ascended into Heaven. Or was it? Was His mission completed? Yes, but only in the sense that our Lord's work of destroying death and offering new life was accomplished by His life, death and resurrection. Human nature was now invited to share in a new life of grace.

Prayerfully imagine standing on the mountain of the Ascension with our Lord. As you gaze upon Him, imagine that you were also present with Him throughout His public ministry. Imagine witnessing His many miracles, the way that He converted the hardest of hearts, the authority with which He spoke, His arrest, torture, death and then His Resurrection. Imagine seeing His hands and feet, once pierced, now radiating glory from those wounds. mycatholiclife.com

As you see our Lord in this way, imagine Him looking at you with love and saying to you that He has chosen to send you forth to the world to be a witness to Him and to all that you have seen and encountered. You are to go forth sharing the Good News of His life, death and resurrection with all whom you come in contact with.

FAITH CHALLENGE: ARE YOU GOING FORTH SHARING THE GOOD NEWS TO THOSE YOU COME IN CONTACT WITH?

Are we living a Life in the Holy Spirit so as to go forth and be a witness to all?

What do we need to do in order to keep moving away from the death of sin and into the life of God? What do we need to do in order to begin doing the work of the apostles in sharing our faith? AND MORE IMPORTANTLY HOW CAN WE DO IT? "Not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit, says the LORD of hosts." Zech 4:6

"So the Holy Spirit does no less than to bring the dead back to life, to make sure we've "got it where it counts".

So, what does it mean to have it where it counts?

It means that however challenging a person's life may be on the outside, God dwells within, and any person in whom God dwells is alive and well in the most important way possible. The Holy Spirit is truly and fully God, so to have the indwelling of the Holy Spirit is to have God within.



St. Paul teaches in Romans 8:11, "If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also, through his Spirit that dwells in you."

And we see in the Gospels and the Acts of the Apostles that the Holy Spirit is critical to the new life the apostles lead. Their transformation is nothing short of an experience of spiritual death and resurrection: death, in their infidelity to Our Lord; resurrection, in the new life they so clearly live as evangelists, apostles, and finally martyrs.

Religious Workforce Protection Act Your Action Urgently Needed

What is the Religious Workforce Protection Act?

On April 9, several U.S. Representatives introduced the Religious Workforce Protection Act, bipartisan legislation to allow religious workers on temporary status with pending applications to stay in the U.S. while waiting for permanent residency. The bill aims to address delays in processing these applications, which can force religious workers to return to their home countries, disrupting services provided by religious institutions. The Religious Workforce Protection Act would allow religious workers to extend their temporary status, enabling them to continue essential services in American communities. There is an equivalent bill in the U.S. Senate.

In the Diocese of Columbus, there are 21 priests and 13 sisters who would be impacted. Three seminarians are presently on student visas, but upon ordination would need to be transferred to a temporary visa and would also be impacted. The impact on diocesan parishes, schools, and Catholic healthcare ministry would be significant.

Bishop Fernandes has worked hard to help promote this legislation for more than two years, and he encourages parishioners to write to their congressional representatives and senators to support this bill.

"If I could emphasize the urgency of this with any greater force I would. Our brothers help us in providing access to the sacraments across the Diocese of Columbus." - Bishop Fernandes
