
LIVESTREAMED MASSES





TRINITY SUNDAY



Trinity Sunday is an invitation to remember that "[being] Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction" (Deus Caritas Est 1). In revealing himself as Trinitarian, God hasn't merely shared impersonal facts about himself; rather, God has shared himself with us, and has invited us into his own inner life and communion of love, which alone is the origin, goal, and meaning of our life. As we read in the Catechism, "By sending his only Son and the Spirit of Love in the fullness of time.

God has revealed his innermost secret: God himself is an eternal exchange of love, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and he has destined us to share in that exchange" (CCC 221). On Trinity Sunday, the Church proclaims the truth about God—that God is love (1 John 4:8)—and the truth about us: we are made for this love. We eternally belong to God—we have an eternal home! catholicapostolatecenter.org

HOLY SPIRIT IN OUR LIVES PART 1

Living Pentecost in everyday life involves:

Openness to the Holy Spirit: Just as the apostles were receptive to the Holy Spirit's guidance, Catholics should cultivate a receptive heart and an openness to the promptings of the Holy Spirit in their lives. This involves prayer, discernment, and surrendering to God's will.

Witnessing to the Gospel: Pentecost empowered the apostles to boldly proclaim the Gospel message. Similarly, we are called to bear witness to the faith through our words, actions, and lifestyles, spreading God's love and truth in our communities and beyond.

Building Unity and Community: Pentecost underscores the importance of unity among believers. Catholics can live out Pentecost in their daily lives by fostering communion, reconciliation, and understanding within their families, churches, and society. catholicus.eu

Pray daily to the Holy Spirit: "Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful..."

Read chapters 14 to 16 of the Gospel of John, where Jesus promises the Paraclete.

Make a novena to the Spirit before every major decision in your life.



Pentecost is not just one day, but every day. Without breath, there is no life. Without the Spirit, the Church is a field of dry, dead bones. The Venerable Fulton J. Sheen once said about the Church, "Even though we are God's chosen people, we often behave more like God's frozen people–frozen in our prayer life, frozen in the way we relate with one another, frozen in the way we celebrate our Faith."

[Bishop Fulton J. Sheen was declared Venerable by Pope Benedict XVI in June, 2012.] Today is a great day to ask the Holy Spirit to rekindle in us the spirit of new life and enthusiasm, the fire of God's love.

Let us repeat Saint John Henry Cardinal Newman's favorite little prayer, "Come Holy Spirit:"

"Come Holy Spirit
Make our ears to hear
Make our eyes to see
Make our mouths to speak
Make our hearts to seek

Make our hands to reach out, and touch the world with your love."

Cardinal Newman was beatified September 19, 2010 by Pope St. John Paul II; he was canonized October 13, 2019 by Pope Francis]
