






Year C: Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)



FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI


Corpus Christi celebrates the great gift Jesus gave us in the Eucharist. We celebrate and honor Jesus' presence in the Eucharist. In Mass, today the homily talked about the importance of preparing ourselves to receive Jesus in the Eucharist. We need to prepare ourselves because after receiving Jesus we become "living tabernacles" and transmit His graces and love to all we meet. Saint Peter Julian Emyard said, "Be the apostle of the divine Eucharist, like a flame which enlightens and warms, like the Angel of his heart who will go to proclaim him to those who don't know him and will encourage those who love him and are suffering."

Jesus tells the disciples to take and receive Him. The God who assumed our human flesh in the Incarnation and will surrender it in the Passion, now gives us His very substance in the Mass. Emmanuel (God-with-us) ensures His permanent presence, not just as a notion we might or might not believe or attend to, with fervour or without, but objectively present, in the Sacrament at the hands of every priest, in the tabernacle at the heart of every Church, in the mouth and being of every Christian. We can talk vaguely about encounter and communion with Christ, but here He is, real, substantial, tangible.

ONLY THE HOLY SPIRIT

Jesus told his Apostles he was sending them a helper, an advocate, the Paraclete to be with them after his time on Earth had ended (Jn 14:16-17). He assured them he was not leaving them but would be with them in a new way.

We should not be surprised that the Holy Spirit works in tangible, concrete ways. For our part, when we recognize and welcome the Spirit's presence in our lives, just as he was in the lives of Jesus' first followers, we, too, will experience the indwelling Spirit as a gift. The Father and the Son are very present to us in the form of the Holy Spirit. It is to our benefit to invite the Spirit's wisdom into our lives with hope and a sense of mission.



There is only one grace-filled conclusion we can reach if we are fine-tuned to the irresistible power of the Holy Spirit: it is unwise and self-destructive to resist his awesome power.

Only the Holy Spirit can jolt us out of our complacency, disengagement and fear, so that we can be driven by the fire of God to curb the power of sin and fill ourselves with boldness and courage.

Only the Holy Spirit stirring in us can assist us in praying as we ought.

Only the Holy Spirit can make us ready to share generously and joyously the gifts we have received for the good of the whole Body of Christ.

Only the Holy Spirit can enable us to learn to speak fluently the language of love as proposed by the new commandment of loving each other as Jesus had loved us from the cross.

Only the Holy Spirit is always intent on teaching us to speak it around the clock, as the only language understood by everyone on the face of the earth, and as the sole unifying force beyond political, ideological, cultural and religious differences. catholicjournal.us
