SUMMER MISSIONARY VISIT

We will be hosting a missionary priest from the Pallottines the weekend of July 19 & 20. Fr. Sahaya Arul, SAC, will be sharing information about their work in India and other missions. The Pallottines, "The Society of the Catholic Apostolate," was founded

in 1835 by St. Vincent Pallotti, a Roman priest. The Pallottines are a Catholic religious congregation serving the Church through apostolic works in 45 countries across 6 continents. St. Vincent Pallotti dedicated his life to helping the poor, sick, marginalized, and orphans, and to educating underprivileged children. Inspired by his vision, Pallottines today serve in parishes, schools, hospitals, missions, and charitable ministries – driven by the love of Christ. (2 Cor 5:14)

Our Mission in India: The Pallottines came to India in 1951. On January 6, 2020, our presence in Tamil Nadu became an independent Province, named after Our Lady of Good Health with more than 100 priests, 50+ seminarians in formation, and a growing, youthful Province.

Our Ministries: We are actively engaged in Pastoral Care in parishes, education with free tuition for poor children, women empowerment through tailoring, fashion design, and beautician courses.

Healing Ministry: We support AIDS/leprosy patients.







At that time the Lord appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. <u>Luke 10:1</u>

Jesus had many followers who were deeply devoted to Him, abandoning everything to serve Him and to cooperate in the fulfillment of His mission. Oftentimes we give most of our attention to the Twelve Apostles when we speak of Jesus' first followers. But in today's Gospel, Jesus sent seventy-two disciples to go forth to all the towns that He would soon visit. Think about that for a moment. Seventy-two is quite a few people. These would not have been casual followers of Jesus. Rather, they clearly were people who were all in and fully committed to Christ. To them, Jesus entrusted the mission of preaching and gave them authority over demons.

The same is true for us today. Jesus is not finished sending missionaries on mission. He continues to gather a vast army of servants whom He calls close to Himself, with whom He establishes a very personal relationship, teaches, forms, bestows with special graces and charisms, and then sends forth to continue His apostolic work. I Killed Maria Goretti: The Life and Repentance of Alessandro Serenelli by Pietro Di Donato

Gripping Account on the Spiritual Transformation of St. Maria Goretti's Murderer Released

While the title of this book is attention getting, it is also appalling. Yet, this is a powerful true story, which is difficult to put down, and merits reading.

I can also see where some people may be "triggered" by this work, especially those who have personally suffered due to similar crimes or experienced something of this tremendous pain in the lives of their loved ones.

The beginning, which chronicles Alessandro Serenelli's demise, portrays how it is due in part to immoral books and images, which are graphically described at times. It also reveals Alessandro's tragic family dynamic which contributed toward his perversion. However, **I Killed Maria Goretti** also provides a unique pathway to healing and forgiveness through the heroic witness of a young virgin saint.

There are many devotees of St. Maria Goretti due to her innocence and fortitude. She couldn't wait to receive Jesus at her First Communion. Maria wanted to become more like Jesus and keep Him close to her heart. When that day finally arrived, she promised Jesus three things: that she would always keep her body and soul pure for Him; that she would often ask Our Lady of Sorrows to help sinners; and that she would pray three Hail Marys each morning and night, asking our Blessed Mother to help her remain pure, strong, and without sin.

In the second part of the book, which focuses on Alessandro's conversion, he has an epiphany regarding the power of the written words that we consume. catholic365.com

Inspired by St. Maria Goretti's radiance when she appeared to him following her death, Alessandro was transformed and spent the remainder of his life growing in holiness.


