FAMILY FAITH FORMATION

Family Faith Formation is Immaculate Conception's religious education program for families with children in first through eighth grades who do not attend a Catholic school, though any parish family is welcome to attend. First through seventh grades use an interactive learning model that enables children of different ages to learn together with their own families and empowers parents to be the ones teaching their children. A catechist plans the lesson, prepares the materials, and is present during each session to guide parents through the day's content.

IMMACULATE CONCEPTION



FAITHFORMATION Immaculate Conception Church

August 24, 2025

From the beginning Jesus has been announced as the Saviour, the Messiah (cf. e.g. 2:11): God's appointed Herald of mercy and life and salvation, not just for Israel but for the whole human race. Nevertheless, with the other Gospel writers, Luke does not hesitate to warn that not all receive this salvation. To use St. Paul's language in Romans, on the one side, there is glory and honour and peace; on the other side, there is retribution, trouble and distress (cf. Rm 2:7-10). The choice is stark, and terrible. So this man in the crowd, presumably in some trepidation and alarm, asks Jesus:



Will there be only a few saved?

Very typically, Jesus here side-steps the direct question. He has no intention of satisfying our curiosity about the hidden mysteries of God's will. Instead he tells us what to do. ἀγωνιζεσθε he says. Strive, fight, battle, make a great effort, focus your energy, be single minded in your determination! Be sure that there is only one way to life, and it's narrow, and difficult! The original audience of Jesus would easily imagine here the little postern gate in a walled City. The heavily laden merchants could not enter that without leaving their wealth behind.

We want everything to be given us as a free hand-out, and have no appetite for devoting hard effort to the work of our own salvation. All the more, then, do we modern people need to listen very carefully to what Jesus says. And what does he say? Surely above all: Do not presume on your salvation! Strive to attain it, as if everything depended on your own effort, even while knowing that all is a free gift of God. Realise that in this business the stakes are very high indeed. Be aware that you personally could land up among those who are counted as last, and ultimately are cast out.

Today's Gospel though does not end on a negative note. We are left with an image of people of every description taking their place at the heavenly Feast. And we are reminded that if there are those now first who will be last, it's also true that the last will be first. In the light of Christ, then, we need despair of the salvation of no one. www.pluscardenabbey.org

The Passion of Saint John the Baptist, observed on August 29, holds deep meaning for Christians. His willingness to die rather than stay silent about the truth sets an example for all believers. John's death shows the importance of staying true to God's laws, even in the face of danger. He is seen as a model of courage and faithfulness. His steadfastness in the face of persecution is a powerful testimony to the strength of his convictions. John's life and death also point to Jesus Christ. Just as John suffered for the truth, Jesus would later suffer and die for the salvation of humanity. John's role was to prepare the way for Jesus, and the Passion of Saint John the Baptist foreshadowed the sacrifice Jesus would make. Through his actions, John helped people see the seriousness of their sins and the need for repentance. He was the voice crying out in the wilderness, preparing the way for the Lord.

The Passion of John the Baptist calls all of us to examine our own lives. His call to repentance is still relevant today. John's unwavering stand for truth challenges us to be honest with ourselves and with others. His life teaches us the importance of repentance and the need to align our lives with God's will. John's example continues to inspire and guide those who seek to live faithfully. young-catholics.com

5TH SUNDAY COLLECTION - PERSONAL STORY

Our St. Vincent de Paul Conference has helped many individuals and families in recent months with food, rental assistance to stop an eviction, and utility assistance to prevent shut-offs. Here is one family's story.

An immigrant couple with three children moved from Texas to Ohio some months ago because of the effect of extreme heat on the two youngest toddlers and the hope of better working opportunities here. The relocation was coordinated with ICE but as their Green Cards expired and ICE devolved, new Green Cards have been delayed. The mother's card expired in April and the father's in June. Their savings dwindled and they did not want to work illegally in order to protect their status as compliant immigrant workers. A hit and run accident totaled their van and replacing it was the end of their financial strength. We were able to stop the electricity and gas from being shut off and we provided assistance with the August rent. They are working with their immigration attorney to get the Green Cards renewed and looking for additional legal avenues to make it forward.


