World Mission Sunday (WMS) is a special day celebrated by the Catholic Church around the world to recognize and support the Church's missionary work. Each year, the Pope chooses a theme for World Mission Sunday. For 2025, the theme is: "Missionaries of Hope Among the Peoples" This theme calls all Catholics — young and old — to be messengers of hope, just as missionaries bring Christ's love to people around the world.

'Here I think especially of those of you who are missionaries ad gentes. Following the Lord's call, you have gone forth to other nations to make known the love of God in Christ... In this way, you are signs of the universal vocation of the baptised to become, by the power of the Spirit and daily effort, missionaries among all peoples and witnesses to the great hope given us by the Lord Jesus.'


Pope's Message for World Mission Sunday 2025

Jesus the Missionary

Excerpt from To the Ends of the Earth: A Pastoral Statement on World Mission.

Jesus was a missionary. As the Word of God, he is the light of all nations. As the Word made flesh, he brought God's own life into our midst. Before returning to the Father, he sent the Church to continue the mission given him by the Father and empowered her with his Spirit: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (Jn 20:21).

The Cost of Proclaiming Christ: the Message of St. Pope John Paul II



What is the cost of proclaiming Christ? We will call the first three duties and the fourth an opportunity, as follows:

The first duty of a person who calls himself a Roman Catholic is to know the truth revealed by Jesus Christ.

The **second duty** is to realize how desperately the modern world needs

The **third duty** is to proclaim what Christ has revealed. The **fourth** is to pay the price of this proclamation. If there is one theme that stands out in documents and addresses of Pope John Paul, it is his insistence on the faithful knowing what God has revealed in the person of Jesus Christ.

Make Christ known where His name has not been heard before. Make Him better known where He is only dimly understood. Above all proclaim Him in circles and among people who were once believers and because they had not been nourished with the bread of Christian truth, have become estranged even from the God who made them.

St. John Paul II discovered the secret of true joy in this world. It is the joy that comes to those who are convinced that Jesus is God; who are convinced that so many are deprived of this knowledge of Christ; who are compelled by their faith to share Christ with everyone even with those who may not be willing to listen, and above all, who are committed to proclaim the Master at no matter what cost to themselves.




SACRED HEART CONGRESS

Saint of the Day: October 22

Patron Saint of young Catholics and families

Born in Wadowice, Poland, Karol Jozef Wojtyla had lost his mother, father, and older brother before his 21st birthday. Karol's promising academic career at Krakow's Jagiellonian University was cut short by the outbreak of World War II. While working in a quarry and a chemical factory, he enrolled in an "underground" seminary in Kraków. Ordained in 1946, he was immediately sent to Rome where he earned a doctorate in theology.

Back in Poland, a short assignment as assistant pastor in a rural parish preceded his very fruitful chaplaincy for university students. Communist officials allowed Wojtyla to be appointed auxiliary bishop of Kraków in 1958, considering him a relatively harmless intellectual. They could not have been more wrong!

Appointed as archbishop of Kraków in 1964, he was named a cardinal three years later. Elected pope in October 1978, he took the name of his short-lived, immediate predecessor. Pope John Paul II was the first non-Italian pope in 455 years. In time, he made pastoral visits to 124 countries, including several with small Christian populations.

The Great Jubilee of the Year 2000, a key event in John Paul's ministry, was marked by special celebrations in Rome and elsewhere for Catholics and other Christians. Relations with the Orthodox Churches improved considerably during his papacy. In his 27 years of papal ministry, John Paul II wrote 14 encyclicals and five books, canonized 482 saints and beatified 1,338 people. In the last years of his life, he suffered from Parkinson's disease and was forced to cut back on some of his activities. Pope Benedict XVI beatified John Paul II in 2011, and Pope Francis canonized him in 2014.
