# 5TH SUNDAY COLLECTION – VINCENTIANS IN ACTION!

KD is a single mother of 5 children (age 11 to 6 months) who also cares for her 14-year-old brother. They lived in their car for 6 months in 2024, but she managed to get a job with enough hours to support an apartment. Then

health issues of the 6-month-old child caused her to cut back on hours for necessary doctor appointments. By the time she had exhausted family support and reached out to our conference, she was 3 months behind on rent with back rent and fees coming up to \$4,300. Our conference worked diligently with Family Services and other conferences to arrange to get the funds together to avoid an eviction. Just when we thought we had all the ducks in a row, the property was sold and a new player entered the scene. One of our conference Vincentians took the lead working with all the parties – Family Services, the old landlord, the new landlord, and other contributing conferences to get the right funds to the right place to avoid the November 1 eviction. KD was set on a new path with confidence that the worst was hopefully behind her.

This story highlights one of many challenges that families-in-need face. Your contributions make it possible for IC Vincentians to help people in financial difficulty. ### IC VOLUNTEERS – NEW DIOCESAN POLICY

Dear Immaculate Conception School and Parish Volunteers,

As part of our commitment to keeping all children safe, **the Diocese of Columbus has recently updated its Safe Environment policies.** The following updates involve all Immaculate Conception School and Parish volunteers over the age of 18, who work with minors.

- All volunteers who have lived in the state of Ohio for 5 years or more, must have a current BCI background check and have completed VIRTUS Protecting God's Children training.
- All volunteers who have lived in Ohio for fewer than 5 years need to complete an FBI and BCI background check as well as VIRTUS Protecting God's Children training.
- This policy update requires all volunteers to renew their BCI fingerprints every five years thereafter.
- All background checks, including FBI and BCI, need to be sent directly to the State of Ohio and to the Diocese of Columbus Safe Environment Office.

In accordance with Bishop Fernandes' guidelines, this policy will take full effect on January 1, 2026, allowing time for everyone to become compliant. If your BCI was last completed prior to January, 2021 you will need to obtain a new background check. Please note that no one may begin volunteering within the Diocese of Columbus until all Safe Environment requirements are complete and documented in VIRTUS. To check the status of your BCI background check and ensure it is compliant, log in to VIRTUS at https://virtusonline.org/virtus/.

We are so grateful for all the ways you give your time and talents to our school and parish. Your support makes such a difference, and this process helps us continue to provide a safe and welcoming environment for all our students and children of the parish.





# FAITH FORMATION

# By your perseverance you will save your lives. Luke 21:19

The Gospel today teaches us about endurance. Jesus assures that those who stand firm will be saved. We must stay strong in our faith, no matter what happens.

Endurance is a key theme in these readings. Jesus tells us that those who endure will be saved. This means that staying faithful is very important. When we face trials, we should remember Jesus' promise. He will give us the strength and wisdom we need. Our faith will help us endure anything.

These readings encourage us to be faithful and diligent. They remind us that God's justice and reward are certain. We must remain steadfast in our faith and actions. The gospel challenges people to think about their actions and faith. Are they living justly? Are they working hard and staying faithful even in difficult times? These readings remind everyone that God is with them and will guide them through trials. By staying strong and trusting in Him, they will find the strength to persevere and receive His blessings.

### Symbols of the Four Evangelists

When you see the four Evangelists—Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John—depicted in art, one quick way to know who is who is to look at their symbols, which are frequently depicted with them.

You'll see a man (usually portrayed as an angel), a lion, an ox, or an eagle. Sometimes artists utilize the symbols as stand-ins for the actual saints, so you'd need to know your symbology to figure out who is represented.

Let's start by matching the right symbol with the right Evangelist:

Matthew: Man/Angel
Mark: Lion
Luke: Ox
John: Eagle

The symbols themselves come from the book of Ezekiel, who had a vision of God in the midst of these four creatures. The Church Fathers interpreted this as a foreshadowing of the four Gospels.

Matthew's symbol is a man because he begins his Gospel with Christ's human genealogy, focusing on Christ the Man.

Mark is represented by a lion because his Gospel starts off with a roar. Right away in the first chapter, we are confronted with the fiery words of St. John the Baptist, the "voice of one crying in the wilderness."

**Luke** is accompanied by an ox, an animal of sacrifice. This is because the first event he recounts is the apparition of the Angel Gabriel to Zechariah, the father of St. John the Baptist. Zechariah, a priest, is offering sacrifice to God in the temple when St. Gabriel appears to announce the impending birth of St. John.

An eagle is the companion of **St. John,** because in his Gospel, St. John "soars" above earthly events to contemplate the Divinity of Christ. His narrative begins with these sublime words: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." getfed/catholiccompany


