

SAFE ENVIRONMENT COMPLIANCE UPDATE

Our parish is blessed with many generous volunteers who help make our ministries, programs, and liturgies possible. As we continue our commitment to providing a safe and welcoming environment for all children and vulnerable persons, we are preparing for the Diocese of Columbus' updated Safe Environment requirements. All volunteers are asked to be **fully compliant with Protecting God's Children training and complete the required background checks by January 2, 2026.** These steps help ensure that our parish remains a place of trust, protection, and faith for every member of our community. **Background Check Requirements**

To meet diocesan policy, the following background checks are required for volunteers:

- BCI (Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation) background check required for all volunteers.
- **FBI background check** in addition to BCI, FBI is required for volunteers who have lived outside the state of Ohio at any point in the past **five years**.

If you currently volunteer, or plan to volunteer in the future, we warmly encourage you to check that your VIRTUS account is active and up to date, and that your background checks have been completed within the required timeframes. Please contact the Parish

Office with any questions or for assistance completing your background check or VIRTUS requirements. Our staff is happy to help guide you through the process. 



FAITH FORMATION

Immaculate Conception Church November 30, 2025

The universal Church begins the new liturgical year with the arrival of the season of Advent -a season with two main themes: looking backward and looking forward. The word "advent" itself means "to come" or "to arrive." In Advent, we prepare for the Lord's coming at the end of time, an appointed time we know not. We are admonished to be watchful and ready for that day (see, among other similar admonitions of the Lord, Mt 24: 42-44).

REFLECTIONS QUESTIONS FOR THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

- How can I bring more peace into my relationships during Advent, especially with those closest to me?
- What habits or attitudes do I need to let go of in order to live more fully in the light?
- How can I renew my faith this Advent season through small, daily practices?
- What does preparing for Christ's coming mean to me personally this Advent?
- In what ways can I be a peacemaker in my family, my workplace, or my community?
- How can I make time each day to connect with God, even in a busy season?
- What distractions keep me from being fully present to God and others, and how can I set them aside?
- How can I invite more honesty and kindness into my actions and conversations?
- Where do I see a need for light in my life, and how can I invite God to guide me there?
- What hope do I hold for this Advent season, and how can I nurture that hope as I prepare for Christmas.

St. Nicholas Feast Day December 6

Be St. Nick For A Day

Give your kids—and yourself!—the chance to be St. Nicholas for a day and really put his spirit of giving into practice!

Don't worry, you don't have to dress up or do anything complicated to imitate the spirit of St. Nick. Here are some simple ideas as to how to pull it off:

- Help out at a food bank, soup kitchen, or another favorite charity.
- Take the family to visit a neighbor who lives alone. Bake some cookies to bring along, and offer smiles and good conversation to someone who might not get any at this time of year.
 - Challenge each family member to do something kind for another member that day. (Collaborating is allowed! E.g., the kids can make dinner for the parents, etc.) catholiccompany.org





What Is the Meaning of Advent?

Within the Catholic faith, the season of Advent holds profound meaning. It serves a twofold purpose:

1-Preparation for the Birth of Christ: Advent is a time to prepare our hearts and minds to celebrate the arrival of Jesus. We reflect on the Messianic prophecies of the Old Testament, their fulfillment in Jesus our hope (1 Tim. 1:1), and thus the mission of salvation he's given to us as members of the one Church he founded.

2-A Call to Conversion: It's also a season of introspection and renewal. The liturgical color purple reminds us of our imperfections and the need for repentance. By acknowledging our shortcomings, we open ourselves to God's grace and prepare ourselves to receive the gift of Christ. Also, penance—such as through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving—helps us to quiet and discipline our hearts for the joy of Christmas (see Catechism 1434). In that light, without an Advent fast it's harder to prepare for a Christmas.


Join us for a Christmas Concert Saturday, December 6, 5:30pm at St. Michael the Archangel

OPEN SHELTER MEAL - MONDAY, DECEMBER 1



5TH SUNDAY COLLECTION - VINCENTIANS IN ACTION!

The last 5th Sunday Collection for this year is this weekend. However, donations to our IC Conference can be made at any time. Donations can be placed in the offertory basket, sent to the Parish Office, or made online at iccols.org>Give Now>choose St. Vincent de Paul from the dropdown box. Your SVdP conference at Immaculate Conception has helped 35 families with

utility and rental assistance. In each case, the assistance was provided as the result of a home visit by two Vincentians for our conference. One of the hallmarks of the Society is the home visit. We try to offer immediate short-term (band aid) support, pointing them to additional resources and financial counseling. In addition, we provided 900 sandwiches to the Holy Family soup kitchen, made by our conference on the 4th Monday of each month. Each Friday, we make food calls to neighbors who are having trouble with both a shortage of food and an inability get out to stores and food pantries. These shut-in food deliveries include food from our pantry and some fresh items purchased at the local grocery and delivered. Each week we serve between 4 to 6 of these neighbors. We are also providing the Bishop Griffin Center and Clintonville Resource Center with turkeys for Thanksgiving. Your contributions and food donations make it possible for IC Vincentians to help people with


