



Immaculate Conception has once again been blessed to receive a very generous grant of \$15,000 from the Catholic Foundation. This grant was awarded for the much-needed roof repairs to the gathering space between the church and Marian Hall. Without this grant money the parish would have to delay even further some of the two million dollars worth of maintenance that is overdue.

RightMark Roofing completed the work over two days, August 18 & 19 — the last two days before school started at a cost of \$28,932.

IC VOLUNTEERS - NEW DIOCESAN POLICY

Dear Immaculate Conception School and Parish Volunteers,

As part of our commitment to keeping all children safe, **the Diocese of Columbus has recently updated its Safe Environment policies.** The following updates involve all Immaculate Conception School and Parish volunteers over the age of 18, who work with minors.

- All volunteers who have lived in the state of Ohio for 5 years or more, must have a current BCI background check and have completed VIRTUS Protecting God's Children training.
- All volunteers who have lived in Ohio for less than 5 years, need to complete a FBI and BCI as well as have completed VIRTUS Protecting God's Children training.
- This policy update requires all volunteers to renew their BCI fingerprints every five years thereafter.
- All background checks including FBI and BCI need to be sent directly to the State of Ohio and to the Diocese of Columbus Safe Environment Office.

In accordance with Bishop Fernandes' guidelines, this policy will take full effect on January 1, 2026, allowing time for everyone to become compliant. If your BCI was last completed prior to January, 2021 you will need to obtain a new background check. Please note that no one may begin volunteering within the Diocese of Columbus until all Safe Environment requirements are complete and documented in VIRTUS. To check the status of your BCI background check and ensure it is compliant, log in to VIRTUS at https://virtusonline.org/virtus/.

We are so grateful for all the ways you give your time and talents to our school and parish. Your support makes such a difference, and this process helps us continue to provide a safe and welcoming environment for all of our students.




Saint Martin de Porres

Pray to Saint Martin instead of complaining when it is time to clean your room.





What jumps out at you today from our Gospel reading?

There's a great temptation when we read the scriptures to develop this otherness, this situation where we see ourselves in Jesus and the disciples, and we see other people in all the other stuff going on. The reality is, is that wisdom is to learn to see ourselves in every person in the Scriptures, to see ourselves in every situation in the Scriptures. And so today, to ask ourselves, "Okay, you might be living a good life." But there might be one aspect of your life that Jesus wants to come in with the whips and turn over the tables, and he wants to cast that out of your life. And so, Jesus was talking about the temple of his body. They were talking about the temple of the temple. We're taught that our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit.

And what does God want to cast out of your life at this moment? What does God want to overturn in your life the same way he overturned the money changers' tables?

What does Jesus want to overturn in your life right now, and will we wait for him to come in and do it, or will we invite him to? I say, Jesus, this needs overturning my life. Come and help me overturn this." dynamiccatholic/Matthew Kelly

4 saints to help you with holy hospitality. Hosting season is upon us. These saints get it.

St. Martha - For when you're feeling frustrated.

We all know Martha. She's the one in the Gospel who's scrambling to set the table while her sister Mary sits peacefully at Jesus' feet. She gets frustrated but who wouldn't? Hosting is work. But Martha also had the courage to proclaim her faith out loud: "Yes, Lord, I believe." When you're tempted to grumble about being the only one wiping down counters, ask St. Martha to help you host with humility.

St. Zita - For the tired homemaker.

Zita was a servant in Italy who did all the behind-the-scenes work without fanfare. She's the patron saint of domestic workers, which makes her a natural companion for anyone running the kitchen like a command center. She didn't complain, didn't demand thanks—she just did her work well, with kindness. Ask her for a little of that quiet steadiness when your guests are eating faster than you can refill the breadbasket.

St. Elizabeth of Hungary - For an increase of generosity.

Elizabeth had royal wealth, but what made her unforgettable was the way she used it. She fed the hungry, gave her best to the poor, and turned her castle into a place of refuge. Hosting can sometimes feel like performance—matching napkins, polished silver—but Elizabeth reminds us that all that is for naught if one isn't giving with real generosity of heart. If your food isn't fancy or your living room isn't picture-perfect, it doesn't matter if you're generous in your love.

St. Pier Giorgio Frassati: For the more casual host.

Not every host is a meticulous planner. Some are more like Pier Giorgio—who loved bringing people together, hiking, and sharing meals. Rather than formal dinner parties or events, St. Pier Giorgio would create spur of the moment gatherings and intimate moments with those who happened to be around him. If you feel pressured to host like Martha Stewart, Pier Giorgio says: relax. Genuine friendship and the intention to share the beatitudes matters far more than a planned tablescape and a 4-course meal.

As Catholics, we must remember that hosting isn't about perfection. It's about presence. These saints lived ordinary hospitality with extraordinary love.

Above all, we should look to Our Lady who was a homemaker to the King of Kings. In simple, humble, service, Our Lady sanctified the tedious and mundane housework that is unavoidable in all hosting pursuits. getfed/catholic company.org


