


CHRISTMAS MEMORIAL POINSETTIAS


SAVE THE DATE – NEW PARISH PICTURE DIRECTORY OPPORTUNITY COMING SOON




PARISH OFFERTORY APPEAL/COMMITMENT

FAITH FORMATION

Immaculate Conception Church

January 4, 2025



Today is the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. While the hustle and bustle of Christmas ends for the majority of people throughout the world on December 26th, for us as Catholic Christians it DOES NOT. Christmas lasts for twelve days! So, during these twelve days it is certainly appropriate to continue to wish one another Merry Christmas! Epiphany in Greek means “manifestation”. In the West, the visit of the Magi is celebrated as the event through which the Lord was “manifested” to the pagans and, therefore, to the world. In the Eastern Church, the accent for this solemnity is on the Trinitarian “manifestation” during the Baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan. While what is central on Christmas is the birth of the Child Jesus, on Epiphany, what is highlighted is that this poor and vulnerable Child is King and Messiah, the Lord of all the earth.

With Epiphany, Isaiah's prophecy is fulfilled, as can be discerned through the first reading: “Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come” (Is. 60:1ff). It's as if the liturgy is saying – don't cut yourselves off, don't give up, don't remain prisoners of your “convictions”, don't be demoralized, react, “lift up your eyes”! Like the Magi, observe “the star” and you will find “the star, Jesus”. vaticannews.va

THE MEMORARE



Where does the Memorare come from? The Powerful Memorare's miraculous reputation precedes it. “Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thy intercession was left unaided...” The Memorare is one of the most powerful prayers in our Catholic treasury. As seen in its opening line, the Memorare begins with the simple acknowledgment of Our Blessed Mother's constant presence in our lives. By emphasizing the simple fact that Our Lady is our steadfast companion and help, the Memorare becomes a prayer of confidence and consolation...and it has a miraculous reputation that precedes it.

The Memorare is sometimes attributed to St. Bernard of Clairvaux, who lived in the 12th century, but its original author is actually unknown. It eventually became the favorite prayer of many powerful saints such as St. Francis de Sales and St. Teresa of Calcutta. Mother Teresa insisted upon the Memorare's power, saying that it never once failed her in times of great need.

Here is the full Memorare: Remember, O most gracious Virgin Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help, or sought thy intercession was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence, I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my Mother. To thee do I come, before thee I stand, sinful and sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate, despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy, hear and answer me. Amen. getfed.com




