




2025 PARISH OFFERTORY APPEAL UPDATE – PLEASE TURN IN YOUR PLEDGE CARD SOON!

FIRST ANNUAL IC CHRISTMAS TREE LIGHTING



and everyone enjoyed hot chocolate, pizza, cookies and activities. Thanks to all who helped make this wonderful event possible.







FAITHFORMATION Immaculate Conception Church

December 14, 2025



In these days of political unrest, scepticism and deep anxiety, it seems naïve to talk about joy. Yet the simple gesture of lighting the third (pink) candle on the Advent Wreath and the cry of "Gaudete" (Rejoice) on the third Sunday, lifts our hearts. The Lord is near! The Advent readings this week, guide us to rejoice, pray and give thanks - pretty good advice and all related. If we recognize all our blessings, we will see that joy is already in our lives and give thanks for it in prayer. However, we can't set out to find and possess joy which we might equate with happiness. Rather it is the result of something else - an unexpected surprise, a reconciliation, a promise fulfilled - and then joy comes to us.

It is a gift. During Advent, the Liturgy is rich in promise and anticipation, increasing each week as we "wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Saviour".

This week, we hear three Advent voices - Isaiah, John the Baptist and Our Lady - to encourage us and increase our hope. Isaiah, in beautiful poetry, speaks of the wilderness blossoming and the sick being healed; signs of the joy of hope fulfilled at what the Lord does for us. We struggle and are tempted to give up but despite our inconsistency, God keeps faith forever so, "strengthen your feeble hands and steady your trembling knees and say to the faint-hearted Courage! Do not be afraid".

We have received the Good News and are constantly called forth, like John the Baptist, from the desert of our desolation and wobbles of faith and even from the prison of despair to rejoice and "bloom where we're planted", confident in the Lord's promise. But it is especially in Mary's discipleship and trust, when she uttered her "Let it be done" that unleashed the power of the Holy Spirit to a new birth in the coming of the Saviour, that fulfilled hope and brought joy. REPENTANCE, PENANCE AND RENEWAL. JOIN US FOR OUR ADVENT PENANCE SERVICE THIS WEDNESDAY DECEMBER 17 AT 7 P.M.

Advent is a time of preparation- preparing our hearts, minds, and souls for the Christ-child who will one day offer each of us salvation through His sacrifice upon the cross. It is a time to quiet ourselves and reflect on God's love and blessings.

Advent is not only a season of preparation; it is also a season of repentance, penance, and renewal. We are called to have a conversion of heart and it is only through complete acknowledgement of our sins, dedication to overcoming the temptations through sincere and fervent penance, as well as with the gift of God's grace, that we can hope to be renewed once again in Christ.

For Catholics this seems easy enough... we are blessed to have the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This makes it easy on us, right? Simply go into the confessional, confess your sins, and voilà, good as new! Right?

Repentance requires more of us than that. True repentance is taking a long, hard look at ourselves and finding all the places we fail. It is admitting that we have not put God at the center of our lives and that we have disrespected Christ through our thoughts, actions, and/or inactions. It is saying we haven't loved others the way He calls us to love. This is hard to do. No one likes to look that closely at themselves. It's scary and unsettling. How could we have become "that person"?

Does it truly matter if we repent or not? Doesn't Christ forgive us anyway?

It matters because sin keeps us separated from God. When we separate ourselves from God we are separated from His graces and love. When we fail to be truly contrite, we tell Christ that His sacrifice is not important to us; that we are comfortable with the wall we are building between us and Him; that our wants and desires are more important than a relationship with Him.

We are each called to look deeply at ourselves to see where we may be building walls between us and God, where we may be failing to be Christ's hands and feet to others, and how we may have turned our back on our Lord. Advent gives us ample opportunity to do just that.



DO YOU VOLUNTEER IN CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES, IC SPORTS, OR ANY PROGRAM INVOLVING CHILDREN? BCI UPDATE DEADLINE – JANUARY 2

Our parish is blessed with many generous volunteers who help make our ministries, programs, and liturgies possible. As we continue our commitment to providing a safe and welcoming environment for all children and vulnerable persons, we are preparing for the Diocese of Columbus' updated Safe Environment requirements.

All volunteers are asked to be fully compliant with Protecting God's Children training and complete the required background checks by January 2, 2026. If you are currently volunteering, your background check must have been completed during the last 5 years. These steps help ensure that our parish remains a place of trust, protection, and faith for every member of our community.

Background Check Requirements

To meet diocesan policy, the following background checks are required for volunteers:

- BCI (Ohio Bureau of Criminal Investigation) background check – required for all volunteers.
- FBI background check in addition to BCI, FBI is required for volunteers who have lived outside the state of Ohio at any point in the past five years.

If you are currently volunteering, or plan to volunteer in the future, we warmly encourage you to check that your VIRTUS account is active and up to date, and that your background checks have been completed within the required timeframes.

Please contact the Parish Office with any questions or for assistance completing your background check or VIRTUS requirements. Our staff is happy to help guide you through the process. Thank you for your faithful service and continued commitment to protecting God's children.
