

Following the closing prayer, those in need of this healing sacrament will be invited to come forward to receive the Anointing. Anyone in need of this Sacrament due to illness, upcoming serious surgery, ongoing treatment for an illness, or disability caused by advanced age is encouraged to attend this Mass. The Rite of Anointing tells us there is no need to wait until a person is at the point of death to receive the Sacrament.

The readings for this Sunday remind us to help others and share our faith. The first reading tells us to feed the hungry, shelter the homeless, and care for those in need.

When we do this, our lives will be filled with light. The second reading says we should rely on Jesus, not on our own wisdom. The gospel calls us to be like salt and light. Salt adds flavor, and light helps people see. In the same way, we should live in a way that brings goodness to the world and points others to God.

We cannot keep our faith hidden. Jesus tells us to let our light shine by doing good works. When we help others, we show God's love. This is how the world can see Christ through us. If we ignore those in need, we are like salt that has lost its taste. Faith is not just words; it is action. We should ask ourselves if we are bringing light to the world or keeping it to ourselves. May Lent find us ready



Lent rarely sneaks up on us by accident. The Church gives us signs well in advance. Readings shift, and there is a subtle invitation to slow down and take stock. Even in the season of Ordinary Time, we know that soon the penitential season will begin.

With one month until the start of Lent, the Church is already asking a quiet question: Are you ready to begin the journey well?

Lent is not meant to be improvised. After all, it happens every year. It is a season of intentional conversion, and like any meaningful pilgrimage, preparation matters. When we wait until Ash Wednesday to think about fasting, prayer, or sacrifice, we often start hurried and distracted. But when we prepare our hearts ahead of time, Lent becomes less about doing more and more about becoming different. Pope's World Day of Sick message: Love by bearing another's pain

Joy of offering closeness

"In the parable, when the Samaritan saw the wounded man, he did not 'pass by.' Instead, he looked upon him with an open and attentive gaze – the very gaze of Jesus – which led him to act."

With this in mind, Pope Leo highlighted that love is not passive, but it goes out to meet the other. Being a neighbor is not determined by physical or social proximity, but by the decision to love. This is why Christians become neighbors to those who suffer, following the example of Christ, the true divine Samaritan who drew near to a wounded humanity.

"The gift of encounter flows from our union with Jesus Christ," he said, stressing, "We recognize him as the Good Samaritan who has brought us eternal salvation, and we make him present whenever we reach out to a wounded brother or sister."

While acknowledging that we live "immersed in a culture of speed, immediacy, and haste—a culture of discard and indifference that prevents us from pausing along the way and drawing near to acknowledge the needs and suffering that surround us," Pope Leo observed that it is precisely in this hectic scenario that we can discover joy from helping others.





Provided the student remains in good standing and continues to attend a Catholic high school in the Diocese of Columbus, the scholarship will be renewed all four years until that student graduates.

The Hands and Feet of Christ Scholarship – This scholarship provides an \$800 scholarship to a student who will attend a Catholic High School next school year at any grade level. The link to apply for the Hands and Feet of Christ Scholarship can be found at <https://catholic-foundation.org/grants/scholarships/the-hands-and-feet-of-christ-scholarship/>. A letter of recommendation from a community leader (clergy, youth minister, teacher, etc.) attesting to the applicant's active involvement in his or her own Catholic faith formation and demonstrated financial need (via FACTS Tuition Assistance) will be used to evaluate the potential applicants. This is a single year scholarship.
