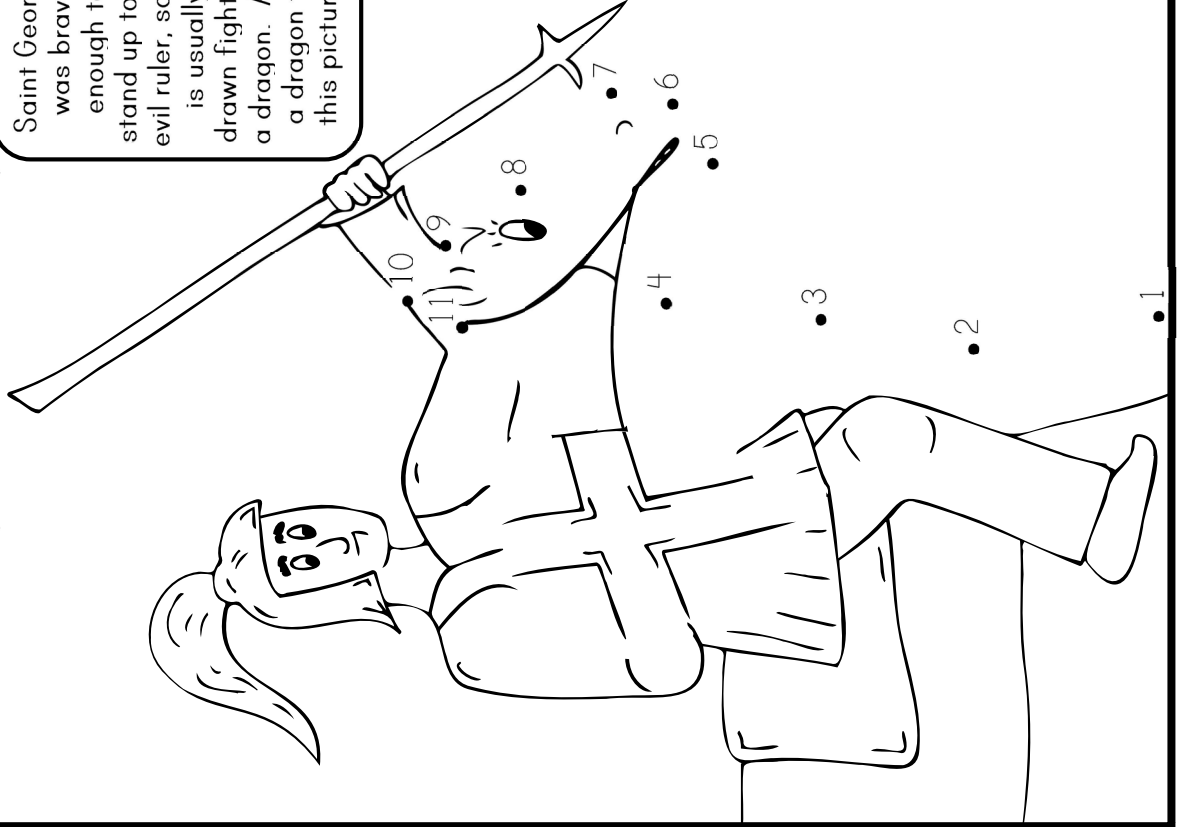

Saint George was brave enough to stand up to an evil ruler, so he is usually drawn fighting a dragon. Add a dragon to this picture.



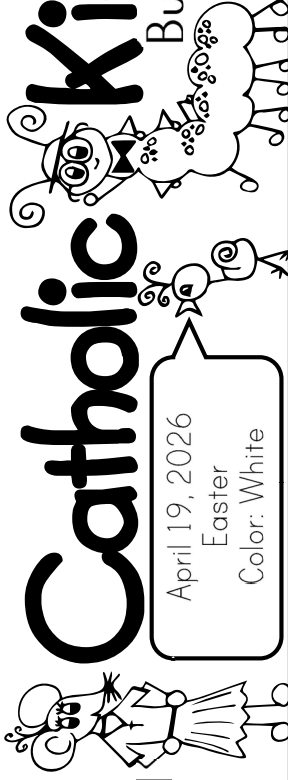

We have all travelled the road to Emmaus. In one way or another at some time, we have all had our hopes dashed. We are the disciples on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35). Christ joined us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us so that we could see our cross or our dashed hopes taken up in the plan of God. We asked Christ to spend the evening with us and then we recognized him in the breaking of bread. Now we too say, "The Lord has truly been raised" (Luke 24:34); we know Christ is present with us. Christ is not just present but transforms us, renews us, and recreates us just as he restored hope and joy once again in the disciples on the road to Emmaus.

What a difference the presence of Christ made in the lives of those two disciples on the road to Emmaus. Before meeting Christ on the road, they were going away from Jerusalem with their eyes downcast, hoping for the redemption of Israel. They stopped their journey because day was almost over. But after meeting Christ, they returned to Jerusalem which they had just left, eyes no longer downcast but opened, and instead of dashed hopes for the redemption of Israel their hearts burned within them. Even though they had stopped the journey when nightfall approached, they now set out at once to return to Jerusalem. That is the difference that the presence of Christ makes. That is the difference the presence of Christ makes in our lives when we focus on Christ instead of on the negative and difficulties.

We have all travelled the road to Emmaus at some time as we had our hopes dashed. But what a difference the presence of Christ makes in our lives. Our eyes are opened to a new way of looking at reality by the Word of God. We recognize the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Christ is not just present but transforms us, renews us, and recreates us just as he restored hope and joy once again in the disciples on the road to Emmaus. frtommylane



Hope is not wishful thinking. Christian hope is rooted in truth: **Jesus is alive.** Because of Him, we know that even in the midst of pain, something greater is coming. The cross wasn't the end of the story, and neither is our suffering.

To live the resurrection means we do not despair. We mourn, yes. We struggle. But we hope. We trust in the promises of God. We believe that the tomb is empty and that our future is full of eternal life.

Pope's April prayer intention: 'For priests in crisis'

Pope Leo XIV releases his prayer intention for the month of April, and invites Catholics to pray for priests who are facing a personal crisis in their vocation.

Pope Leo XIV has urged Catholics across the globe to join him in April in praying for priests in crisis.

He released the monthly "Pray with the Pope" video on Tuesday, which is prepared by the Pope's Worldwide Prayer Network.

In his prayer, the Pope entrusted all priests into the Father's hands, especially those going through moments of crisis, "when loneliness weighs heavily, when doubt clouds their hearts, and when exhaustion seems stronger than hope."

God, he said, knows their struggles and wounds as they seek to accept His unconditional love as "humble and cherished disciples" and not as "mere functionaries or lonely heroes."

"Good Father, teach us as a community to care for our priests: to listen without judging, to give thanks without demanding perfection, to share with them the baptismal mission of proclaiming the Kingdom in word and deed, and to accompany them with closeness and sincere prayer," prayed the Pope.

He invited Catholics to support the men who "so often support us."

Pope Leo prayed that the Holy Spirit may "rekindle in our priests the joy of the Gospel." vaticannews
