SPRING CLEANUP WAS A GREAT SUCCESS

A tremendous thank-you to everyone that helped out at the IC Spring Cleanup. There was a lot to do, but the effort was equal to the task and we got everything done on the list. So happy and grateful for the volunteers giving their time and energy to improve the IC Campus! A special thank-you goes to John Bruzesse and the members of the Garden Ministry who helped organize and facilitate this undertaking.



AN UPDATE ON PARISH/SCHOOL FACILITIES

Thanks to the ongoing generosity of our IC parish community, we have been able to address the following day-to-day repairs and maintenance of our campus facilities, as well as complete some significant projects. Since last summer, we resealed the south Rose Window in the church, trimmed and pruned over 14 trees and shrubs on campus, and repaired and replaced the flooring in 3 classrooms in our school. Also, a significant repair/replacement, we replaced the shingle roof over the gathering space in August 2025, and in February 2026, we completed a new layover rubber flat roof over Marian Hall, giving it new life and a 20-year warranty. In 2025, we replaced and repaired the fallen coping stones over the south school entrance, and repainted the entire gym, stage and hallway areas of our school during the summer of 2024. In the summer of 2024, we installed an automatic "changeover" valve for the HVAC system in the church. This allows the heat to work when it's cold outside and when the temps warm up, the valve allows the system to automatically change over to cooling. This used to be a manual procedure and has been a fantastic update. We will soon replace our fire alarm panel in the school that needs an upgrade to bring it up to code.

Due to your regular and ongoing offertory and financial support, we have been able to accomplish these repairs and upgrades. We thank you very much!!

Widgets are typically designed to enhance user experience by providing quick access to commonly used features, real-time updates, or personalized content.

This service will thus make it possible to strengthen the communion of American dioceses and parishes as well

as all the dioceses and parishes worldwide wide with the Successor of St. Peter, a pressing need especially today in the era of fake, A.I.-generated content. The Vatican considers this initiative important and urgent also in view of the fact that the Pontiff's mother tongue is English and, for the first time in history, the Pastor of the Universal Church is a citizen of the United States. 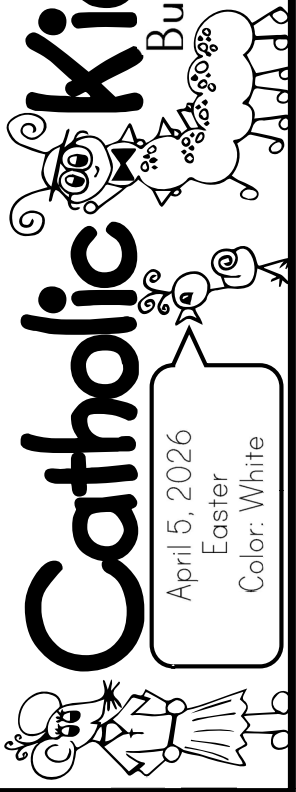

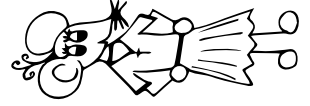

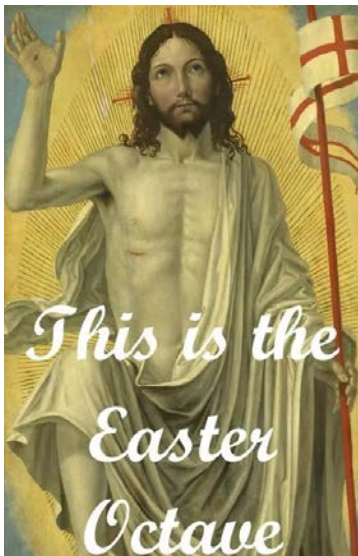


ALLELUIA HE IS RISEN

It's a stubborn point in fact, that Christians profess the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. This story is so familiar to us that we can sometimes lose sight of how stunning it must have been for Jesus' closest disciples to arrive at his burial place, only to find an empty tomb. For, as the Gospel writer John points out, they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead (Jn 20:9).

Yet, what today we may take for granted, these same disciples – these Apostles of Jesus Christ – would later lay down their lives for the truth of what they believed, for the truth of what they professed, for the truth of who they would come to know as died, buried, and risen from the dead. The Christian martyrs down through the centuries are the heroic witnesses of this *Profession of Faith*.

Jesus Christ invites each of us – He invites all of us – to new life. We begin by opening our hearts to him in the mystery of the Resurrection. Two-thousand years later there are many who, for whatever reasons, do not believe, they do not profess, they do not yet recognize with the eyes of faith. But we, by virtue of our baptism, are called to bring the Gospel of Jesus Christ, truly risen from the dead for the salvation of the world, to the world that still lives in darkness. Jesus is the Light of the World. Easter morning he opened heaven for the salvation of all who come to believe in him. ***Be not afraid! Jesus is waiting for you when you find nothing else in this world satisfies you.*** reason2becatholic.com



For Catholics, the joy of Easter Sunday is so immense that it cannot be contained to a single day. In fact, the Church celebrates the Resurrection of Jesus Christ for eight full days, culminating in the feast of Divine Mercy Sunday. This eight-day period is known as the Easter Octave, and it is a time of profound grace and spiritual renewal.

The Greatest Week of the Church Year

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! The comprehension and joy of this amazing gift of Christ conquering sin and death by His death and resurrection cannot be confined to just one day. The Church as a mother understands the needs of man. Within the liturgical calendar there is a built-in pattern that corresponds to human rhythms: times of preparation and penance building up to major feasts with celebrations that are prolonged, and multi-level feast days spread throughout the year. The Easter Octave gives us time to impress upon our souls the mysteries, joys and graces of the greatest feast of the Church. Each day of the Octave the liturgy dwells on the mysteries of the resurrection of Christ and our own resurrection through the sacrament of Baptism.
