IC PARISH FESTIVAL – MAINTAINING THIS TRADITIONAL PARISH/COMMUNITY EVENT

For generations, our summer Festival has been one of the most loved traditions in our parish and school community. It brings together families, friends, alumni, neighbors, and parishioners for a weekend full of fellowship, fun, and memories, while also serving as one of the parish's most important fundraisers each year. As we look ahead to Summer 2027, we are prayerfully seeking one or two couples to step forward to serve as Festival Chairs. The role primarily involves:

- Leading monthly planning meetings from February through July
- Checking in periodically with area chairs throughout the planning process
- Communicating updates with the Parish Office
- Being available during Festival week for deliveries, set up, and helping wherever needed during the event

While it is certainly a commitment, you will not be doing it alone. The structure is already in place, and there is strong support built into the process. New chairs would shadow during this year's Festival and planning season, then officially take over the following year with continued support from outgoing chairs as well as your own incoming shadow chairs. Serving as Festival Chair is a meaningful way to give back to the parish community and help preserve a tradition that means so much to so many families. It is incredibly rewarding to see the community come together because of the work behind the scenes. **At this time, we also want to be honest with our parish and school families: if we are unable to find new leadership for the Festival, we may need to consider canceling the Festival for 2027 or exploring a very different model moving forward.**

We truly hope to continue this special tradition for years to come, and we ask you to prayerfully consider whether you might be called to help lead it into the future. 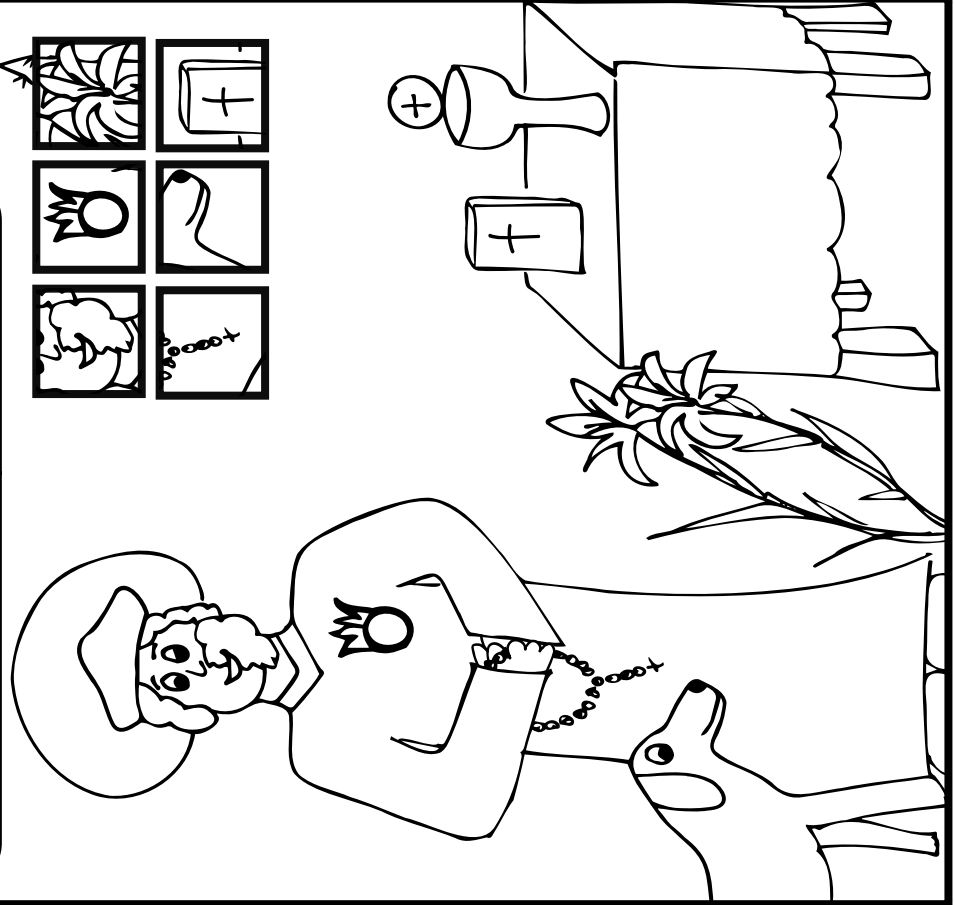
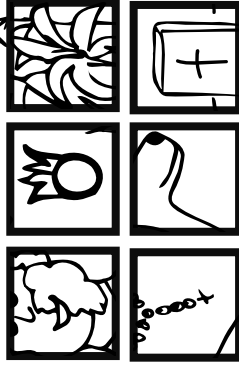

God's love appeared to Saint Philip Neri. It looked like a ball of fire and entered his heart.

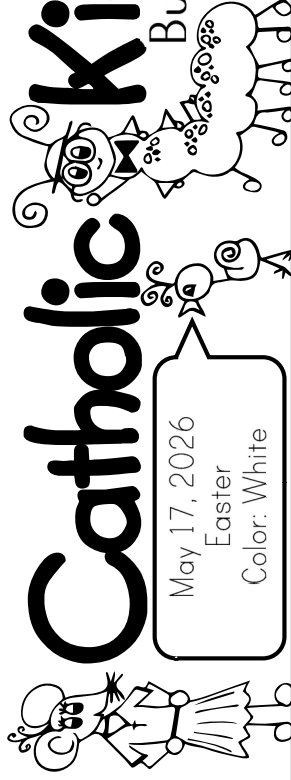

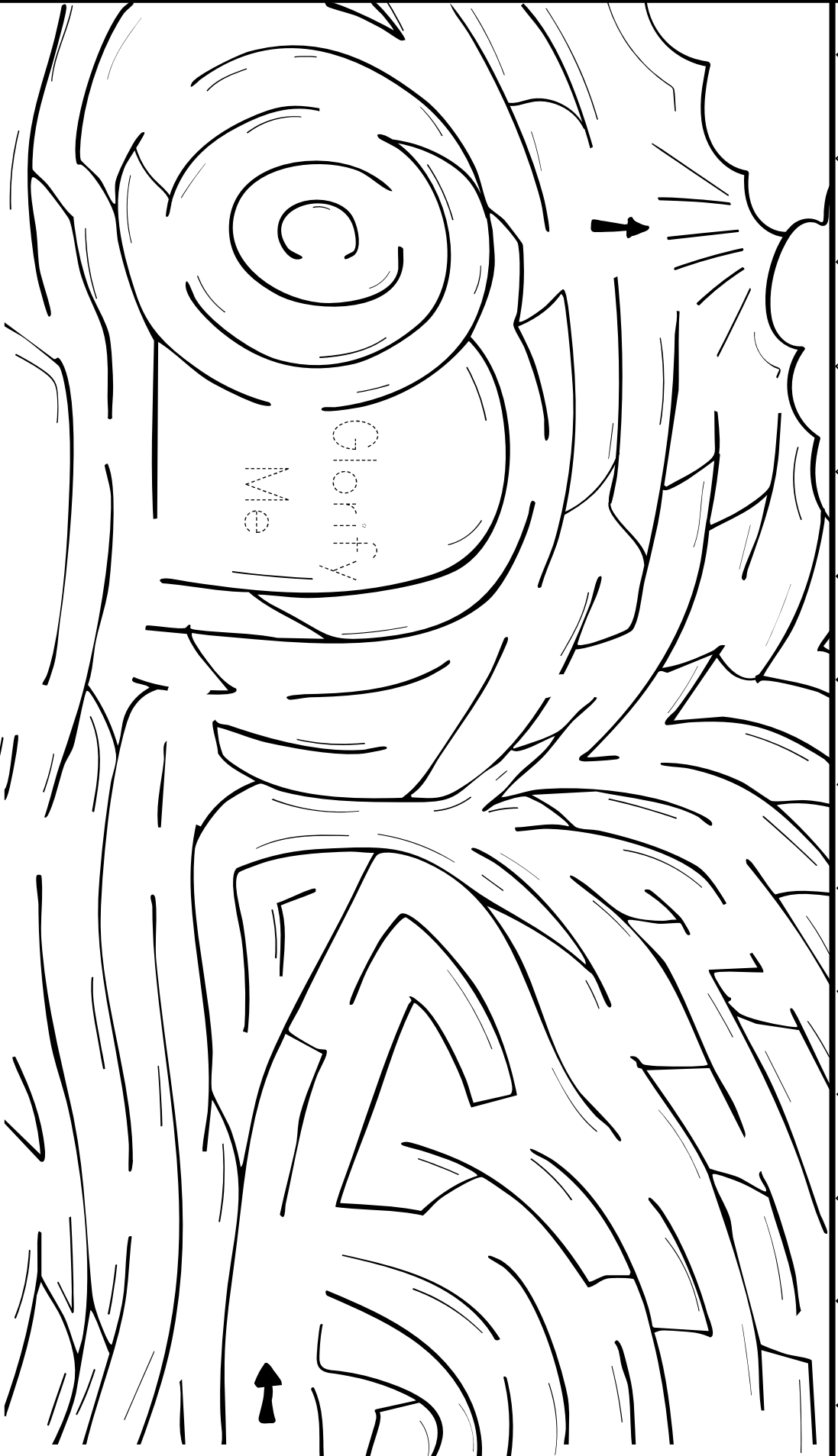
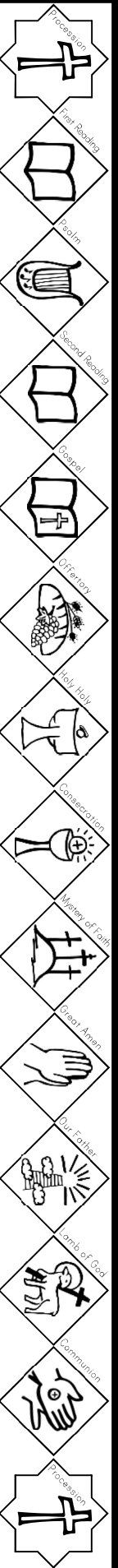

Immaculate Conception Church May 17, 2026



Today, the Church celebrates Christ's Ascension into heaven. After his Resurrection, the Lord appeared to his disciples over 40 days, teaching them and encouraging them, and preparing them for his Ascension — and then the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

We've been reading from his appearances during those 40 days on Sundays, and even during the week, to take in those encounters the disciples had with the risen Christ, equipping them to be his witnesses now to the nations. As eyewitnesses they can explain, they can proclaim the resurrection of Jesus Christ in this new life that he has won for us. As he speaks to them during these appearances, the Lord Jesus says he has to go back to the Father in heaven from where he descended in his Incarnation. At the same time, he promises that he will be with them until the end of time.

The feast of the Ascension, which we celebrate today, celebrates a great truth revealed by the Lord. That Lord has been lifted beyond our sight into heaven, and at the same time, remains with us until the end of time. When the Lord ascended into heaven, he did so that he could be present to us in a new and powerful way. We'll celebrate that reality next Sunday with the feast of Pentecost. Because of the Lord's Ascension, there would be room for the Holy Spirit to be poured out on the disciples unleashing spiritual power that gave birth to the Church and sustains her in our day and until the end of her mission on earth. The Holy Spirit brings this new chapter in the life of those who follow Christ, making them sharers in his divine life and a new and powerful way.

What Are the Nine Choirs of Angels and the Roles God Gave Them?



The Seraphim: Angels of Love

The Seraphim are the highest choir, known for their burning love for God. The name "Seraphim" comes from a Hebrew word meaning "to burn," reflecting their intense devotion.

The Cherubim: Guardians of Knowledge

The Cherubim rank just below the Seraphim and are associated with divine wisdom and knowledge.

The Thrones: Bearers of Justice

The Thrones complete the first hierarchy and are linked to God's justice and authority. Their name suggests they serve as the "seat" of divine judgment.

The Dominions: Leaders of Angels

The Dominions, or Dominations, are the first choir of the second hierarchy. Their name implies authority over other angelic beings.

The Virtues: Movers of Creation.

Virtues are known as the Spirits of Motion and control the elements. They are sometimes referred to as "the shining ones."

The Powers: Warriors of Heaven

The Powers, or Authorities, protect creation from evil forces. They are seen as warriors who combat demonic influences.

The Principalities: Guardians of Nations

They are mentioned in *Ephesians 3:10* as part of the heavenly order. Catholic teaching, per CCC 331, ties angels to God's governance of the world.

The Archangels: Messengers of Great Events

The Archangels deliver significant messages and lead God's people. Their name means "chief angels," indicating their prominence. Scripture names three: Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael

The Angels: Personal Guardians

The Angels, the lowest choir, are closest to humanity. They serve as guardian angels, assigned to each person. Catholic teaching, per CCC 336, states that everyone has a guardian angel from birth to death.
