IC PARISH FESTIVAL – MAINTAINING THIS TRADITIONAL PARISH/COMMUNITY EVENT

For generations, our summer Festival has been one of the most loved traditions in our parish and school community. It brings together families, friends, alumni, neighbors, and parishioners for a weekend full of fellowship, fun, and memories, while also serving as one of the parish's most important fundraisers each year.

As we look ahead to Summer 2027, we are prayerfully seeking one or two couples to step forward to serve as Festival Chairs.

The role primarily involves:

- **Leading monthly planning meetings from February through July**
- **Checking in periodically with area chairs throughout the planning process**
- **Communicating updates with the Parish Office**
- **Being available during Festival week for deliveries, set up, and helping wherever needed during the event**

While it is certainly a commitment, you will not be doing it alone. The structure is already in place, and there is strong support built into the process. New chairs would shadow during this year's Festival and planning season, then officially take over the following year with continued support from outgoing chairs as well as your own incoming shadow chairs.

Serving as Festival Chair is a meaningful way to give back to the parish community and help preserve a tradition that means so much to so many families. It is incredibly rewarding to see the community come together because of the work behind the scenes.

At this time, we also want to be honest with our parish and school families: if we are unable to find new leadership for the Festival, we may need to consider canceling the Festival for 2027 or exploring a very different model moving forward.

We truly hope to continue this special tradition for years to come, and we ask you to prayerfully consider whether you might be called to help lead it into the future. Future Festival Chairs: We are looking for a couple of individuals who would be interested in shadowing our current Festival chairs this year, with the goal of stepping into the role next year.

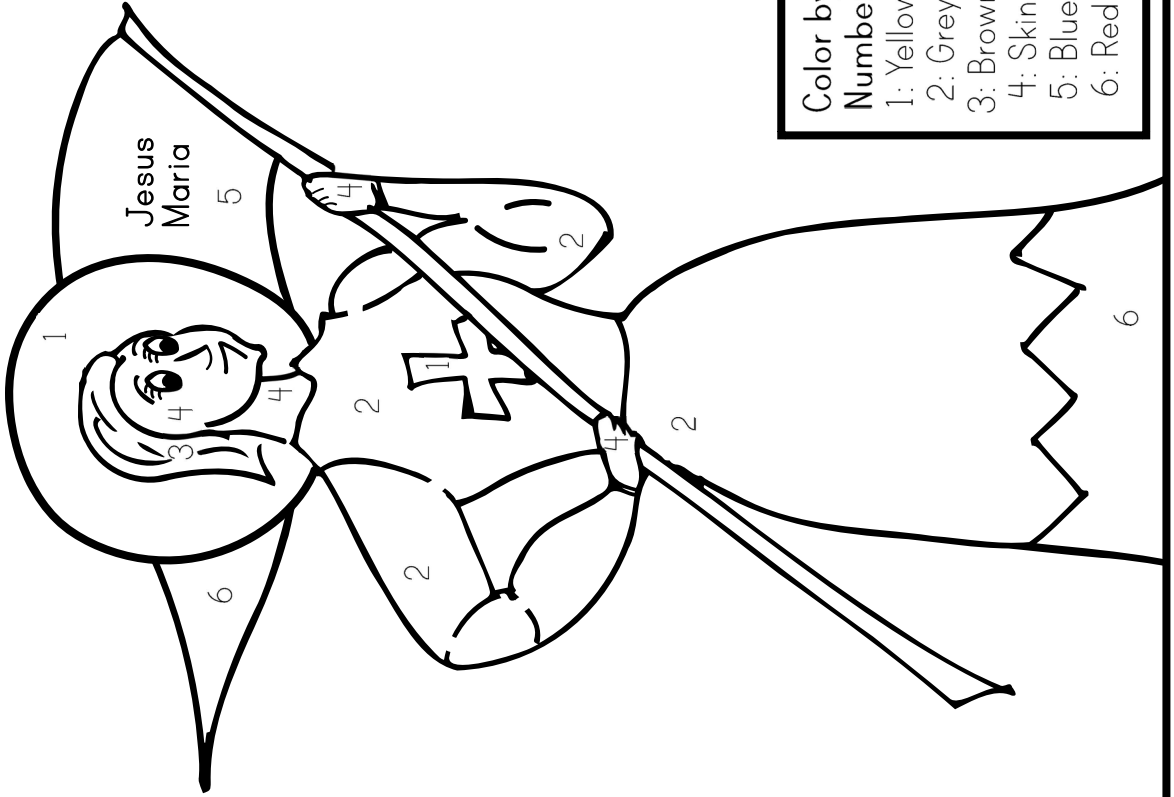

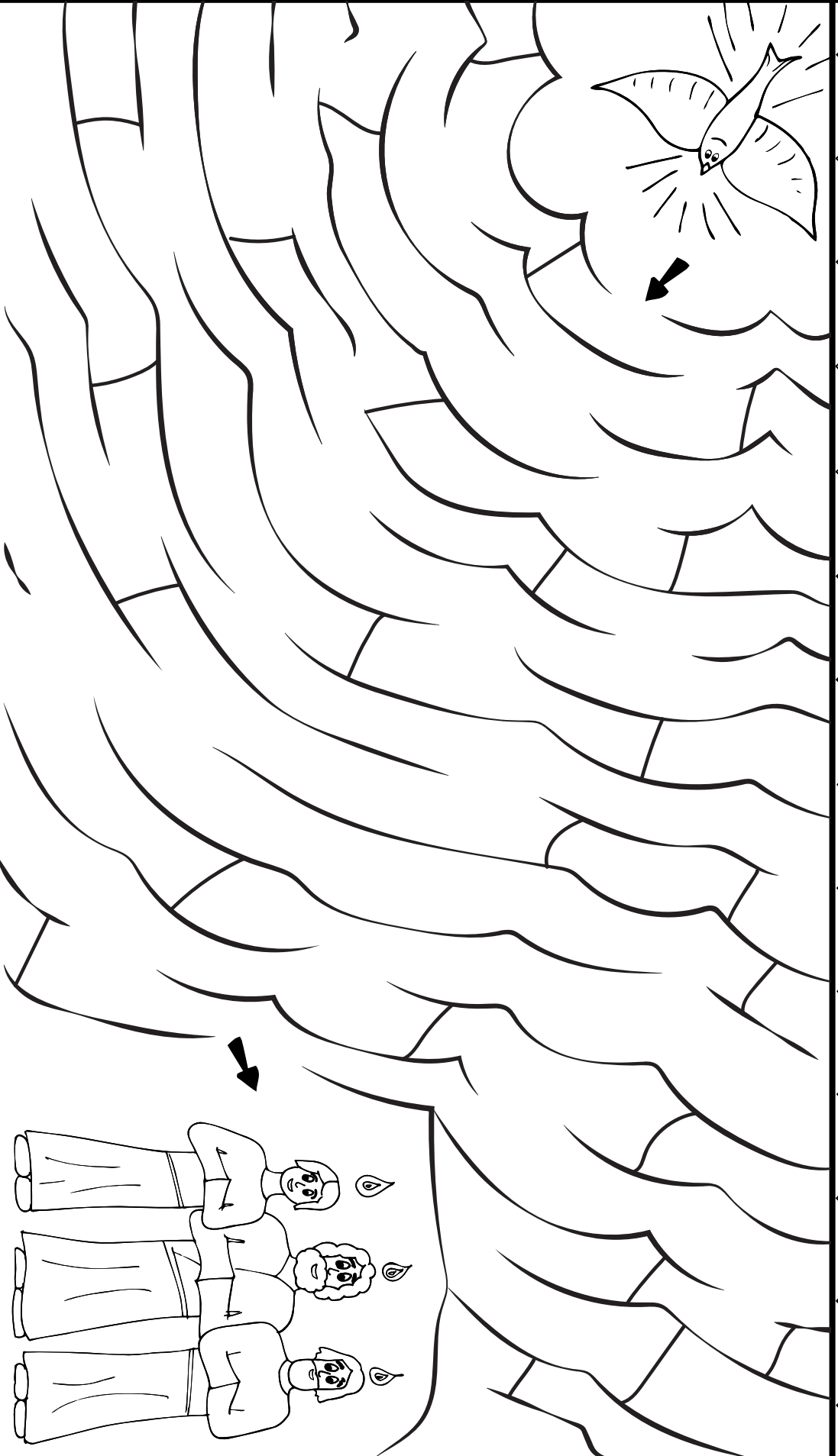
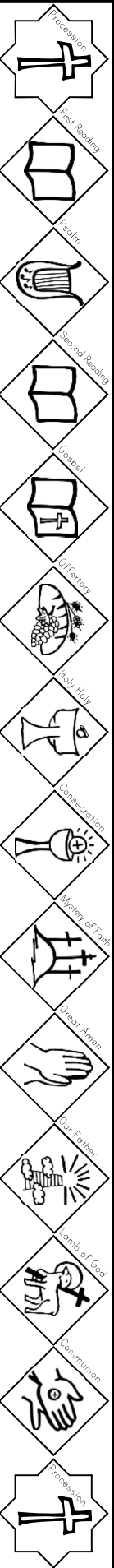

COME HOLY SPIRIT



The feast of Pentecost is the third most important holy day celebrated within the Church, with the first most important being Easter and the second being Christmas. Pentecost is ultimately the celebration of the Holy Spirit Himself because of who He is, what He does for us as individuals, and what He does for the Church as a whole. The Catechism of the Catholic Church affirms that the Church was made manifest to the world on Pentecost through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, and that this begins the age of the Church, in which Christ continues to act through the sacraments and the liturgy. In founding his one Catholic Church, Jesus restored and fulfilled the kingdom of God, as his Church is indeed the New Covenant Israel. catholic answers.com

The transformation of the apostles by the power of the Holy Spirit is one of the primary themes of Acts. The Holy Spirit empowered the apostles to boldly proclaim the Good News of Jesus at the risk of their own lives.

The contrast between the apostles' words and deeds in the gospels and in Acts is stark. In the gospels every right move the apostles make seem to be followed by a misstep or two. To their eternal credit, they leave behind everything they have to follow Jesus. They see Him perform miracles, yet they're terrified by the storm. They question what good He can do with five loaves and two fish. Peter proclaims Him the Messiah, then urges Him not to take up His cross. They receive Him in the Eucharist and abandon Him the same night. Peter is ready to fight and die for Him one hour and denies Him three times in the next. They see Him in His resurrected glory, eat and drink with Him by the shore of Galilee, but they are not yet ready for their divine mission to spread the gospel to the ends of the earth.

No doubt all of these experiences, good and bad, were necessary for the apostles to lead the early Church. Our journey of discipleship in our sinful condition is often one of two steps forward, one step back. But Pentecost really highlights the necessity of being filled with the Holy Spirit to proclaim the gospel and share the love of Jesus with others. Pentecost was the culminating event that transformed the apostles and gave them the courage to build the Church.

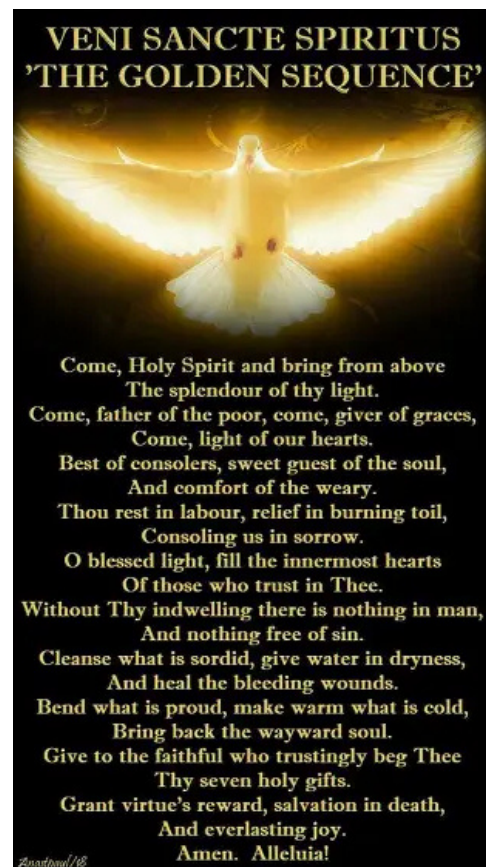
Jesus had been crucified in Jerusalem fifty days earlier. His triumphant entry into the city, His controversial preaching at the temple, where He drove out the moneychangers and confounded the religious leaders, and above all His death on the cross were highly public events. The whole city knew who He was and what had happened to Him. The apostles were immediately putting their lives at risk by proclaiming His resurrection. And beyond that, who was going to believe them? Who would believe that a crucified man, tortured and killed for the whole city to see, could rise and live again?

The Holy Spirit gave them the courage to proclaim that the Lord is risen. The Holy Spirit gave them the wisdom to say the words that would pierce the hearts of their listeners. The Holy Spirit filled them with love of Jesus and the love of poor sinners that they had to proclaim the Good News of our salvation, in spite of every obstacle, in spite of every cost.

The transformation of the apostles by the Holy Spirit is a powerful testament to our need to ask God for the Holy Spirit to carry out the good works He has given us to do.

“And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened. What father among you would hand his son a snake when he asks for a fish? Or hand him a scorpion when he asks for an egg? If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the holy Spirit[e] to those who ask him?” (Luke 11:9)

Your SVdP conference at Immaculate conception has helped more than 35 families with utility and rental assistance. In each case, the assistance was provided as the result of a home visit by two Vincentians from our conference. One of the hallmarks of the Society is the home visit. We do not just funnel support; we meet with the neighbor, listen to their immediate needs and also to their deeper needs. We try to offer immediate short-term support, pointing them to additional resources and financial counseling. In addition, we have provided over 1,000 sandwiches to the Holy Family soup kitchen, made by our conference of the 4th Monday of each month. We also make food calls to neighbors who are having trouble with both a shortage of food and an inability get out to stores and food pantries. These shut-in food calls provide food from our pantry and some fresh items purchased at the local grocery and delivered.


