Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I first want to express my joy on the occasion of being installed as the pastor of Immaculate Conception by Bishop Fernandes last Sunday. It was a beautiful Mass, and I personally found it very moving and edifying. I hope those of you who attended also experienced the joy and beauty of the ceremonies and were edified by them. I was so grateful to have a packed Church for the Mass as well. It was great to see so many of you there and at the reception. I know those of you who could not attend were united with us in prayer. I also want to express my gratitude for all who helped prepare for the Mass and reception and all who served in any capacity the day of. What was Our Lady's silent message at Knock?

In the late hours of August 21st, 1879, Our Lady appeared in Knock, Ireland...

Our Lady was silent.

Though she did not utter a word, Our Lady's presence brought peace, strength, and comfort—and conveyed a message as relevant today as it was 140 years ago. It was August 21st, 1879, and the sun was about to set over the city of Knock in County Mayo, Ireland, when the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared.

She was beautiful, wearing a dazzling white cloak and a spectacular crown. Her demeanor was perfectly serene, with her hands and head held in reverent prayer. Although silent, Our Lady did not appear alone. She was accompanied by St. Joseph on her right and St. John the Evangelist on her left.

Alongside these three heavenly figures was a Eucharistic Lamb, centered in front of a cross, presenting Himself upon an altar and surrounded by a cohort of angels. This miraculous image remained for hours, shining brightly and remaining dry, despite the fading evening light and heavy summer rainfall.

While Our Lady has appeared several times throughout history, bringing guidance and healing, at Knock her appearance was distinctive. It was the only time Our Lady has appeared alongside the Eucharistic Lamb. Without speaking a word, Our Lady continues to guide her children, leading us to her Son's presence in the Eucharist. getfed.com



QUEENSHIP OF MARY AUGUST 22



One of the most beautiful and universal titles of the Blessed Virgin Mary is her title as Queen, honored on the August 22nd feast of the Queenship of Mary, the octave day of the feast of her Assumption. What does this mean, and what is the Church tradition on this doctrine of the Catholic Faith? Here is a primer on the profound spiritual mystery behind this Marian title.

The Queenship of Mary is very closely associated with the dogma of her Assumption into heaven. Catholic Tradition holds that once Mary, the Mother of God was assumed into heaven at the end of her earthly life, she was then crowned as Queen of both Heaven and Earth to reign alongside her Son, the King. This is why the two events in Mary's life are side by side in the Glorious Mysteries of the Holy Rosary.

John Paul II, in his apostolic letter Rosarium Virginis Mariae writes of this Glorious Mystery of her Coronation:

“Christ was raised in glory to the right hand of the Father, while Mary herself would be raised to that same glory in the Assumption, enjoying beforehand, by a unique privilege, the destiny reserved for all the just at the resurrection of the dead. Crowned in glory – as she appears in the last glorious mystery – Mary shines forth as Queen of the Angels and Saints, the anticipation and the supreme realization of the eschatological state of the Church.”

Here we see that after the end of Mary's earthly life she was exalted even above the angels in heaven, having a unique privilege and place as the Mother of Jesus Christ, who is both fully God and fully man.

Mary's glory in heaven is a picture or foreshadowing for all Christians of the similar heavenly glory meant for those who share in her Son's passion, death, and resurrection. She received first, and in the most perfect way, that which is destined for all of us. ewtn

VOTING AS A FAITHFUL CITIZEN

Forming Your Conscience to Prepare for the Election

While the heat of campaign season awaits, the November election will come quickly. As Catholics, we are called to be faithful citizens and engage in elections. Now is a good time to start preparing by first forming your conscience in accordance with Church teaching before you research candidates or issues.

The first step is living a life rooted in prayer, Scripture, sacraments, and study. Throughout August, consider the following:

- **Prayer:** How often do I pray? How might the Lord be calling me to deepen my prayer life with Him?
- **Scripture:** How often do I pray with or read Sacred Scripture? How might the Lord be calling me to spend more time with His Word?
- **Sacraments:** How often do I frequent the Sacraments? How might the Lord be calling me to encounter Him more often in the Sacraments, particularly in Holy Communion and Confession?
